Introduction

This Preliminary Abandonment and Restoration Plan has been organized and will be in effect specifically for the Gwich'in Wellness Camp (Rachel Reindeer Camp) outside of Inuvik NT. All our programs and services are offered at the facility. The facility (camp site) is located at:

Camp Facility

- **Water System**

All water pumps, water tanks, and water lines will be disassembled and removed of all water at the end of the project/seasonal period.

- **Fuel Storage Sites**

All fuel will be pumped into drums (counted) and drums taken off site and stored in the Town of Inuvik for proper disposal.

- **Chemicals**

All chemicals such as cleaning supplies and mechanical supplies will stored in a proper location with all other mechanical supplies and have proper disposal once finished.

- **Contamination**

During any fuel spill, the spill will be reported to the Oil & Chemical Spill line at 867-920-8130. Any contaminated soil will be treated as per the Spill Contingency Plan. Photos will be taken of the spill, before and after soil contamination clean up. Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada is available to provide additional and proactive inspections.

- **Waste**

All waste products (food and garbage) are bagged and shipped to the Town of Inuvik and disposed of in the municipal solid waste facility.

- **Inventory**

A full inventory will be conducted (fuel, supplies, equipment and supplies, etc). A complete inspection along with photos taken of the camp site at the end of the project will be carried out.

- **Reclaimed to the Original State**

The site would be reclaimed to the original site, or as close to as possible and to the satisfactory of the Land Owner, Board and Inspector.

Camp Facility

- Absolutely all equipment, pumps, generators, motors etc., will be disassembled and removed from the camp site.
- All chemicals and detergents will be completely removed from camp site and properly disposed of once in town.
- All fuel storage locations (fuel tank) will be removed at project closure. Any spills and contamination will be cleaned up and removed.
- All infrastructures (camp buildings) will be removed completely and land be returned to its initial state, to the best of one's ability.
- The site would be reclaimed to the original site, or as close to as possible and to the satisfactory of the Land Owner, Board and Inspector.
- A final and complete inspection will be taken by the supervisor to ensure proper closure of camp facility. Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada is available to provide additional inspections.
- Final photos will be taken of facility by the Supervisor at the end of the project closure and Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada is available to provide additional inspections and photos.
