Thanks so much for the information, Elaine. I have some notes on my previous discussions with Ervin Allen, who suggested it may be wiser to keep the area for a wood marshalling yard and keep the capital equipment there, rather than clearing more land for the same purpose in the same area, which of course is an unnecessary duplication of resources. The area is cleared and we are looking at converting to a wood marshalling yard.

We of course, will clear whatever refuse and petroleum products are located but it is a bit much to have to move the existing sawmill and other capital equipment to another area even though the licence expired. All is needed in the area is basic clean up.

We will follow the MVLWB process and will require an on-site visit by your personnel when the snow clears but for the most part, we are looking for a renewal of the licence and the site falls within DKFN traditional territory.

I will complete the required forms and will keep in direct contact with you to see this through. Thank you.



Hi Elaine,

DKDC is in receipt of your October 15 letter addressed to Mr. Stephen Cuthbert on the above subject. I spoke to you and Irvin Allen earlier this year on this to get advice on how to renew the permit as we are looking to keeping the area for a wood marshalling yard under the GNWT Biomass initiative. Biomass includes wood products and waste.

To be in good standing and be eligible for a renewed licence for that specific area, I have been directed to do the background work so DKDC can hopefully have the licence in place by March 31, 2013. I will require your help to make this happen.

Is there anybody local or in the region that can help me? Irvin Allen seemed to have a good idea on what DKDC wishes to do to make the area aesthetically appealing but in the end, we want to use for a woodmarshalling yard. There are some old trees and the area was clear cut so other than clearing the wood refuse, there is not much remediation involved in a final plan. We still want to keep the sawmill and other capital equipment there for future use as DKFN has a long standing history of supplying sawmill products since the North opened up and we want to keep that practice.

Thanks and if you gather and email a template(s) on a final plan, we can get this thing started asap.

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
