Conditions Annexed to and Forming Part of Land Use Permit MV2012J0017

Part A: Scope of Permit

1. This Permit entitles Redbed Resources Corporation to conduct the following activities:
 - a) Operation of a camp at Coates Lake and Mineral exploration at the sites identified in their application.
2. The Permit is issued subject to the conditions contained herein with respect to the use of land for the activities and area identified in Part A, item 1 of this Permit.
3. Compliance with the terms and conditions of this Permit does not absolve the Permittee from the responsibility for compliance with the requirements of all applicable federal, territorial, and municipal legislation.

Part B: Definitions

“**Act**” means the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*.

“**Board**” means the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board established under Part 4 of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*.

“**Greywater**” means all liquid Wastes from showers, baths, sinks, kitchens, and domestic washing facilities but does not include Toilet Wastes.

“**Inspector**” means an Inspector designated by the Minister under the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*.

“**Permeability**” means the capacity to transmit water through a medium.

“**Sewage**” means all toilet wastes and Greywater.

“**Sewage Disposal Facilities**” means Sump(s) and/or Sewage collection tank(s) designed to hold Sewage.

“**Sump**” means a man-made pit, or natural hollow or cavity in the earth's surface used for the purpose of depositing waste material therein.

Part C: Conditions Applying to All Activities (the headings correspond to subsection 26(1) of the Mackenzie Valley Land Use Regulations)

26(1)(a) Location and area

1. The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application. LOCATION OF ACTIVITIES
2. The Permittee shall not conduct any part of the land use operation within 300 metres of any privately owned or leased land or structure. PRIVATE PROPERTY

3. The Permittee shall use an existing campsite, as described in the accepted application. CAMP LOCATION

26(1)(b) Time

4. The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact an Inspector at (867) 669-2757 at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation. CONTACT INSPECTOR

5. The Permittee shall advise an Inspector at least ten days prior to the completion of the land use operation of: REPORTS BEFORE REMOVAL
- a) The plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials; and
 - b) When final clean-up and restoration of the land used will be completed.

26(1)(c) Type and size of equipment

6. The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type, size, and number that is listed in the accepted application. ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT

26(1)(d) Methods and techniques

7. When sampling, the Permittee shall not: GEOLOGICAL SAMPLING
- a) Make any excavations which will result in a visible scar;
 - b) Use explosives; and
 - c) Use any power tools except hand-held portable tools used for sampling.

26(1)(e) Type, location, capacity, and operation of all facilities

8. The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean at all times. CLEAN WORK AREA

26(1)(f) Control or prevention of ponding of water, flooding, erosion, slides, and subsidence of land

9. The Permittee shall prepare the site in such a manner as to prevent rutting of the ground surface. PREVENTION OF RUTTING

10. The Permittee shall not move any equipment or vehicles unless the ground surface is in a state capable of fully supporting the equipment or vehicles without rutting or gouging. VEHICLE MOVEMENT FREEZE-UP

26(1)(g) Use, storage, handling, and ultimate disposal of any chemical or toxic material

11. The Permittee shall not use chemicals in connection with the land use APPROVAL OF

- operation that were not identified in the accepted application. CHEMICALS
12. The Permittee shall dispose of all combustible waste petroleum products by removal to an approved disposal facility. WASTE PETROLEUM DISPOSAL
13. The Permittee shall dispose of all toxic or persistent substances as described in the approved Waste Management Plan. WASTE CHEMICAL DISPOSAL
14. The Permittee shall report spills immediately to the 24-hour Spill Report Line, (867) 920-8130, in accordance with instructions contained in the "NT-NU Spill Report" form. REPORT CHEMICAL AND PETROLEUM SPILLS
- 26(1)(h) Wildlife and fish habitat**
15. The Permittee shall take all reasonable measures to prevent damage to wildlife and fish habitat during this land use operation. HABITAT DAMAGE
16. The Permittee shall construct and maintain the water intake using the DFO recommended 2.54 millimetre fine mesh size to prevent entrainment of fish. Other dimensions must follow DFO's "Freshwater Intake End-of-Pipe Fish Screen Guidelines". PREVENT ENTRAINMENT
17. If migratory birds or their nesting areas or any species at risk are encountered during the course of operations, the Permittee is to minimize all activity so as to not disturb these animals. MINIMIZE ACTIVITY
18. The Permittee shall cease operations when caribou are in the immediate vicinity of any area where work is proceeding. CARIBOU HARASSMENT
- 26(1)(i) Storage, handling, and disposal of refuse or Sewage**
19. The Permittee shall adhere to the approved Waste Management Plan and shall annually review the Plan and make any necessary revisions to reflect changes in operations, technology, chemicals or fuels. Revisions to the Plan shall be submitted to the Board for approval. WASTE MANAGEMENT
20. The Permittee shall dispose of all sewage and grey water into a sump at least 100 metres from the high water mark of any watercourse. SEWAGE IN SUMP
21. The Permittee shall keep all garbage and debris in a secure container that is acceptable to an Inspector, until disposal. GARBAGE CONTAINER
22. The Permittee shall dispose of all garbage, waste, and debris as described in the approved Waste Management Plan, unless otherwise authorized in writing by an inspector. REMOVE GARBAGE
23. The Permittee shall burn all combustible garbage and debris, except plastics, daily, in a container acceptable to an Inspector. INCINERATION
