Greetings,

Attached is the AQM weekly summary report for Giant Mine for week ending January 24, 2015.

In discussions with the Giant Mine Working Group, in lieu of the detailed weekly reports the project has decided to provide weekly summaries and a detailed monthly report. This is done to make the reporting more useful to users, while still maintaining the level of details previously provided.

A summary of the report is provided below:

Fenceline Network:

- Fenceline air quality monitoring was shut down for the season mid-day on Friday, January 23, 2015, coinciding with completion and wrap-up of the Interim Underground Stabilization (IUS) program (tailings work).

Community Stations

- There were no continuous 24-hour average concentrations of particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter (PM_{2.5}) and no continuous 24-hour average PM₁₀ concentrations above the referenced criteria measured at the community stations during the week.
- There were no laboratory results for TSP, PM₁₀, and trace metals (including arsenic) received during the week. Laboratory results from samples collected at the community stations after January 9, 2015 are pending.
- There were no laboratory results for asbestos received during the week. Laboratory results from asbestos samples collected at the community stations after January 15, 2015 are pending.
- The 3-day sampling schedule for 24-hour integrated TSP, PM₁₀, trace metals, and asbestos monitoring at the community stations has changed to a 6-day sampling schedule starting on January 24, 2015. The 3-day sampling schedule will resume following start-up of remediation activities some time during spring 2015.

Interim Underground Stabilization (IUS) (tailings work)

- Air quality monitoring near the IUS work resumed on January 5, 2015 in support of remaining IUS activities (tailings work). This monitoring was completed and shut down on January 20, 2015 for the winter coinciding with shut down of tailings harvesting work activities.
- There were no analytical 24-hour arsenic results received during the week from samples collected at six locations near IUS work activities around the North and Central Tailings Ponds. Analysis of archived filter results collected January 5 - 24, 2015 is pending and/or on hold pending request for analysis.

General Operations

- The AQM program operated as specified during the week ending February 21, 2015 with the exception of:
 1. Data from the PM₁₀ BAM monitors at the NAPS station was unavailable due to unknown causes. Efforts are currently underway to make PM₁₀ BAM data from NAPS available for reporting.

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
