Joe thank you for the report dated August 9, 2016

I note that you inspected the lodge on August 9, coincidentally we were also there the afternoon Aug 9.

Please be advised that we will be going back to Mackay Lake Lodge Sept 2-5-12-18 and will be doing a major clean up and removal of wast and empty drums etc at that time and we do have some mineral and tourism activities scheduled.

We will be removing items that no longer have a useful purpose and will re-organize items that we plan to keep and or recycle.

We are also working on a three year plan that will include some renovations and repairs to buildings which have deteriorated since the caribou hunting ban and our financial problems resulting from the loss of revenue. We do hope to develop some new products and eventually replace the diesel generators with clean energy, wind and solar power and renovate buildings like the taxidermy shop for other uses in the future.

We do point out that the diesel fuel stains at the existing generator were accumulated since 1983 when the Rocher family started the lodge. almost 35 years ago and we do point out that plants including dwarf birch trees are growing in the oils stained soils so there is no significant environmental impacts.. We did remove several drums of impacted soils last year

WE request a review of the rulings and requirements that we remove the fuel stained soil to an approved facility in Yellowknife. We request to use them as dust suppressant and fill on the runway. By c/cing this email we are asking GNWT Lands and MVLWB to advise us on a review of the LUP permit conditions.for this..

We also would like a review of our incinerator, the use of fuel as an accilerant and use of the traditional burying site to be continued. We point out that the aerial photos confirm that our burning and burial site is very clean, no garbage and environmentally friendly.

As we have stated in the past , we believe that our traditional practices are more environmentally freindly and affordable than flying and hauling materials back to approved facilities in Yellowknife, Again we request Lands and MVLWB advise on a review or appeal of the LUP conditions
