**Comment:** EC notes that the EC contact number on page 16 - ii) Off-site resources is incorrect.

**Recommendation:** In the case of a spill or emergency, the 24 Hour Northwest Territories Spill Report Line should be contacted first, who will then involve EC Emergencies. For information relating to the environmental enforcement and reporting requirements under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999 and the Fisheries Act please contact the EC Environmental

Enforcement 24 Hour Duty Officer at 780-499-2432. EC also has a National Environmental Emergencies Centre (NEEC) whose primary role is to provide technical and scientific environmental advice and assistance to the lead agency, in the event of an environmental emergency. A lead agency is described as the governmental authority that regulates or has authority over the activity from which the emergency originated. EC helps to identify the environmental protection priorities and provide advice on ways to reduce the pollution's impact on the environment. This advice can include weather forecasts, location of wildlife and sensitive ecosystems, and expertise on spill counter-measure and remediation options. NEEC can be contacted at 849-997-2800.
