

# Engagement Plan

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## Introduction

This Plan describes the engagement activities that Pine Point Mining Limited will undertake over the life of the Land Use Permit and Water License that covers the confirmation drilling program at Pine Point. A copy of the engagement log is attached; it covers engagement activities to date specifically related to the land use and water license applications for 27-month confirmation drilling program.

## Project Location

Confirmation drilling may be planned and conducted within the boundaries of any of the 19 Mineral Leases and 4 Claims registered to Pine Point Mining Limited that are to be part of this program. The locations of the leases and claims held by Pine Point Mining Limited in the Pine Point District that are to be included in this program are shown in Figure 1.

## Potentially Affected Parties

The following list of potentially affected parties have been identified as being the most likely to be affected by the confirmation drilling program at Pine Point. This list was developed based upon overlap of PPML’s mineral leases and claims with existing surface leases or traditional lands (DKFN, Metis Nation and Councils, Timberworks, Avalon, and Hamlet) as well as interest in project-related activity in the Hay River area (WPFN, KFN, and Town).

- Hamlet of Fort Resolution
- Town of Hay River
- West Point First Nation
- K’atlodeeche First Nation
- Deninu K’ue First Nation
- Hay River Metis Council, Fort Resolution Metis Council, & Northwest Territory Metis Nation
- Timberworks, Inc.
- Avalon Advanced Materials, Inc.

However, Pine Point Mining Limited “cast a wider net” to inform additional parties in the South Slave region about the project during initial engagement efforts (see Engagement Log). At the time of initial engagement activities the anticipated project footprint included some claims that were subsequently removed from the plan. Under the larger footprint scenario, there was overlap with cabins, a power substation, cemetery, and surface lease held by Teck Metals. Engagement was initiated with those parties. Once the project footprint was decreased, those parties were no longer directly affected by the project.

## Engagement Triggers

PPML has signed Exploration Agreements in place with some of the Affected Parties, and the confidential terms of those agreements have separate engagement triggers and requirements. Those terms are not discussed here.

Pine Point Mining Limited will contact the potentially affected parties listed above in writing at different points throughout the project as follows:

- Amendments – All parties contacted in writing.
- Assignments – All parties contacted in writing.
- Drill Locations, Access Path, and Expected Footprint -- GNWT Inspector and MVLWB notified in advance of field deployment. This information will be submitted on a 1:50,000-scale map with coordinates and map datum provided to an Inspector. MVLWB posts this information to the project registry which is then available to all parties.
- Initiation of Drilling Activity – All parties contacted in writing 30 days before annual start-up.
- Completion of Exploration Program – All parties contacted in writing within 60 days.

## Engagement Methods

As stated above, Pine Point Mining Limited will attempt to engage with potentially affected parties over the life of the active confirmation drilling program. Written notification of planned activities will be provided to potentially affected parties. These notices will contain contact information at Pine Point Mining Limited whereby the potentially affected parties can ask questions, raise concerns, suggest project modifications, etc.

## Engagement Log

Pine Point Mining Limited will maintain a permit-specific engagement log over the life of the permit. This log will be available for the MVLWB to review to ensure that the engagement plan has been followed and that issues raised by potentially affected parties have been considered and addressed (when possible).


