Good morning Matt,

As outlined in your licence (Part E, condition 4) the submission of a Thermal Plume Delineation Study Design Plan (including the requirement identified Schedule 2, condition 1) is required and was submitted on January 16, 2020. As noted in the Plan, NTPC will be updating instrumentation which will in turn have an effect on the data being collected for the study and the development of the thermal model.

We would like to point out that a Thermal Plume Delineation Study Report is due for Submission to the Board on August 1, 2021.

With the delay in study design approval and a subsequent delay in sampling, Board staff are asking for confirmation that you will still be able to meet the seasonal sampling requirements identified in Schedule 2 and ultimately meet the August 1, 2021 Thermal Plume Delineation Study Report submission.

If this is the case, the updated Thermal Plume Delineation Study Design Plan would need to be submitted to the Board for review and comment by April 10, 2020.

As outlined in the licence the submission dates are all linked to provide information which will inform the AEMP Study Design, which also has a submission date specified in the licence condition (Part F, condition 2) of November 1, 2021.

We would also like to bring to your attention that any deviation or change in the submission dates as outlined in the licence would require an amendment process to be complete. The amendment process is much the same as a public hearing process.

Can you please confirm the above.
