**Subject:** S03a-007 and S03L1-015 Lac Maunoir proposed Drilling Program

The Inuvik Regional Health and Social Services Authority - Environmental Health Services has reviewed the noted project.

It was noted that a sleigh camp and other camp operations are proposed. Therefore, compliance with the Revised Regulations of the Northwest Territories, 1990 under the Public Health Act is expected. Specifically:

1. R.R.N.W.T. 1990.c.P-12 Consolidation of Camp Sanitation Regulations;
2. R.R.N.W.T. 1990.c.P-14 Consolidation of Eating or Drinking Places Regulations;

3. R.R.N.W.T. 1990.c.P-16 Consolidation of General Sanitation Regulations;
4. R.R.N.W.T. 1990.c.P-22 Consolidation of Public Sewerage Systems Regulations, and
5. R.R.N.W.T. 1990.c.P-23 Consolidation of Public Water Supply Regulations.

The practice of ground discharge of sewage from camps is not an acceptable form of sewage disposal to satisfy public health. Many acceptable forms of sewage treatment and disposal exists, rather than relying on spreading untreated sewage on the ground. Please provide this office with appropriate sewage disposal plans.

Potable water supplies in the NWT must be treated as authorized by a Health Officer. The plan to test and or treat drinking water is not adequate. Please provide this office with proper water treatment plans, so that they me authorized to protect the health of workers.

Be advised that an Environmental Health Inspection of camp facilities may occur sometime during the operating season.
