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1 Stakeholder Engagement

Husky is committed to comprehensive, meaningful, and ongoing engagement with stakeholders and, most specifically, with the local communities. In preparation for submitting this application, and in accordance with the Land and Water Boards of the Mackenzie Valley Engagement and Consultation Policy (MVLWB, 2018), Husky has developed and implemented an engagement plan that seeks to identify and mitigate concerns raised by stakeholders and maximize opportunities and benefits in the region. This engagement plan will guide Husky's activities by ensuring that affected stakeholders are identified; key issues and concerns are identified and addressed; and, where reasonable and feasible, feedback is incorporated back into project planning.

Husky is also committed to building local employment capacity and continues to work with communities and organizations to identify employment opportunities and support related training.

Husky initiated consultation on the Slater River project in 2010 and has consistently provided the communities with public meetings and updates.

Consultation was conducted in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2017, and 2018. Public meetings were previously held in Tulita, Norman Wells, Fort Good Hope, and Deline. Consultation for the abandonment, reclamation, care and maintenance portion of this program was initiated in 2018. In each case presentations and updates were provided. Due to COVID19 restrictions and an abundance of caution, having sought advice and direction from SLWB, consultation has been commenced remotely through email and phone calls. Husky has provided presentation materials to the organizations summarized in Table .

Initiated August 13; the remote consultation process is iterative. Additional stakeholders have been added through the process as required or requested and responses will be ongoing until supplemental requests for information are exhausted.

Husky reached out to each stakeholder initially to make contact, ensured the appropriate contact has been made and confirmed contact details. Having provided the consultation materials, Husky commits to continue engagement of stakeholders at ongoing dates beyond submission of this application as follows:

- seeking confirmation of project information materials;
- ensuring an opportunity for response to the provided materials; and/or
- providing additional information or ongoing engagement.

Onsite tours and flyovers will be made available, during times of operations, when safe to do so.

Husky has provided a detailed project description of ongoing Slater River reclamation, care and maintenance, as outlined in section 3.0 of this document.

Husky has a strong record of consultation and engagement with individuals and organizations in the Sahtu area and will continue throughout the duration of Husky’s operations within EL494. Among those contacted were representatives from organizations summarized in Table 1- 2 and details are provided in Appendix A-1.

The EL462/463 Project Committee is mandated by the Access Agreement and Benefits Agreement. The Project Committee includes three representatives from Husky and one representative from each of the three local land corporations (FNMLC, NWLC, and TLC) and has three basic functions:

- to facilitate communication with Husky and the land corporations;
- requirement to qualify Dene and Métis businesses that have been registered in the Tulita District; and
- managing an annual budget for each of the ELs and to screen, review and approve requests for community support (donations).

In the past year, funds have been donated to a variety of programs, initiatives and community events including:

- TRRC and NWRRC fall hunts.

The Project Committee has regular correspondence as Husky receives donation requests. We have held teleconference calls and email communication. The current Project Committee representatives from the three Land Corporations (LCs) also sit as board members of their respective LC and have been kept apprised of Husky activities in the region and specifically on the proposed well abandonment program.

2 Commitment to Communities and Relationship Building

Husky has also committed to the education of the youth within Tulita District. For several years Husky has donated annually to the Chief Albert Wright School in Tulita to fund their healthy breakfast and snack program.

Husky is committed to build and maintain positive relationships with stakeholders in the Tulita District. Husky was instrumental in funding, and assisting with the planning, for construction of a traditional moose-skin boat. The initiative allowed for the preservation of skills and created an opportunity for Elders and youth to work together.

2.1 Training and Job Shadowing Opportunities

During Husky's previous operations from 2012 - 2014, Husky provided twelve training opportunities to local residents. Although the winter 2018/19 abandonment program was a much smaller scale and shorter in duration than previous programs in the area, Husky offered the following training opportunities to residents in Norman Wells and the Tulita District:

- Standard First Aid;
- Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS);
- H2S Alive;
- Transportation of Dangerous Goods (TDG);
- Husky Procurement Bidders Workshops;
- Husky Site Safety Orientation; and
- Job Shadowing.

In previous years of operations, Husky personnel spent considerable time in the Tulita District to evaluate contractor safety management systems and work directly with vendors to provide specific training, depending upon gaps identified during the evaluation process. This training helped prepare them for work with major oil and gas companies which require a standardized Safety Management System.

Husky is continuing with inspections and minor maintenance, as well as one maintenance cycle if required, based on future inspections. Please refer to section 12.4 for potential employment opportunities.

Husky will maximize the use of local businesses and services from the Sahtu Region, presuming that they meet the technical and safety requirements. Beneficiary companies will be given preference as per the Benefits Agreement (on file with the SLWB under Exploration Licence Numbers 462 and 463, Dated Sep 11, 2011).

2.2 Traditional Knowledge

A Traditional Knowledge (TK) study was conducted by the Tulita Renewable Resources Council (TRRC) and took place in 2011. The TK information was collected and was previously submitted to the SLWB in association with LUP S11T-002. In 2013 this information was submitted again to SLWB as part of LUP S13X-003.

2.3 Employment Opportunities

Husky has provided the employment opportunities as part of Husky Slater River programs and will continue providing employment and business opportunities to local businesses and individuals as part of proposed Project. The proposed Project will create jobs, training opportunities, and revenue for local contractors.

Road maintenance, fuel truck driver, water truck driver and medic personnel will only be required during an active cycle of maintenance utilizing heavy equipment. The maintenance cycle is anticipated to occur once over the 5-year period of the new LUP and WL.

One of, or both the Environmental and Wildlife monitors will be required during active site inspections, while labour personnel may be required if project deficiencies are noted on future inspections. Minimum and Maximum numbers are listed to give a range of personnel required.

Additional detail on the potential employment opportunities provided by the program are listed in Table 1-3. Actual employment numbers will be summarized in an annual report.

Project 2020-2025 Project Scope

For the purpose of this scope, project components will fall under two work categories, reclamation or care and maintenance. There will be no new footprint, no new surface disturbance and no new construction.

- The Slater River Program will require no new lands or new access.
- No new water sources will be utilized.
- All proposed activities on the schedule will occur annually over the 5-year time period of the proposed Land Use Permit and Water Licence, with potential for a 2-year extension or renewal.
- Most care and maintenance activities will be conducted during the summer.
- If major repairs are required, they may be conducted during the winter months.
- A third-party environmental assessment determined that the proposed project scope activities will have negligible to low environmental impacts when appropriate mitigations are applied.

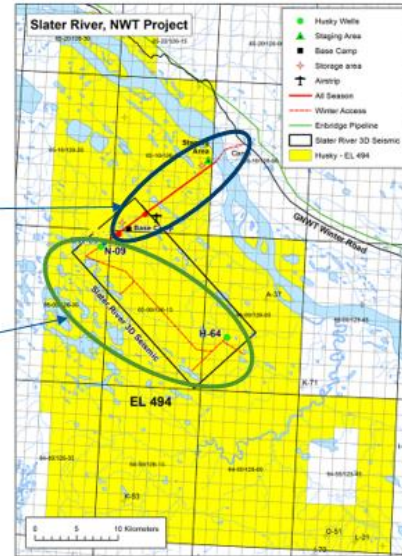

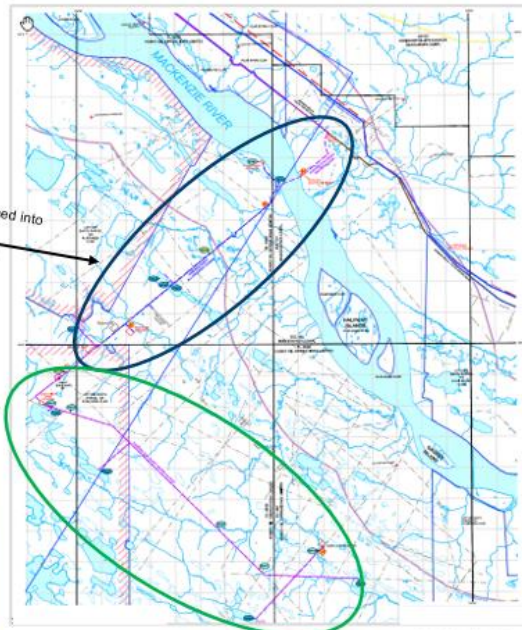

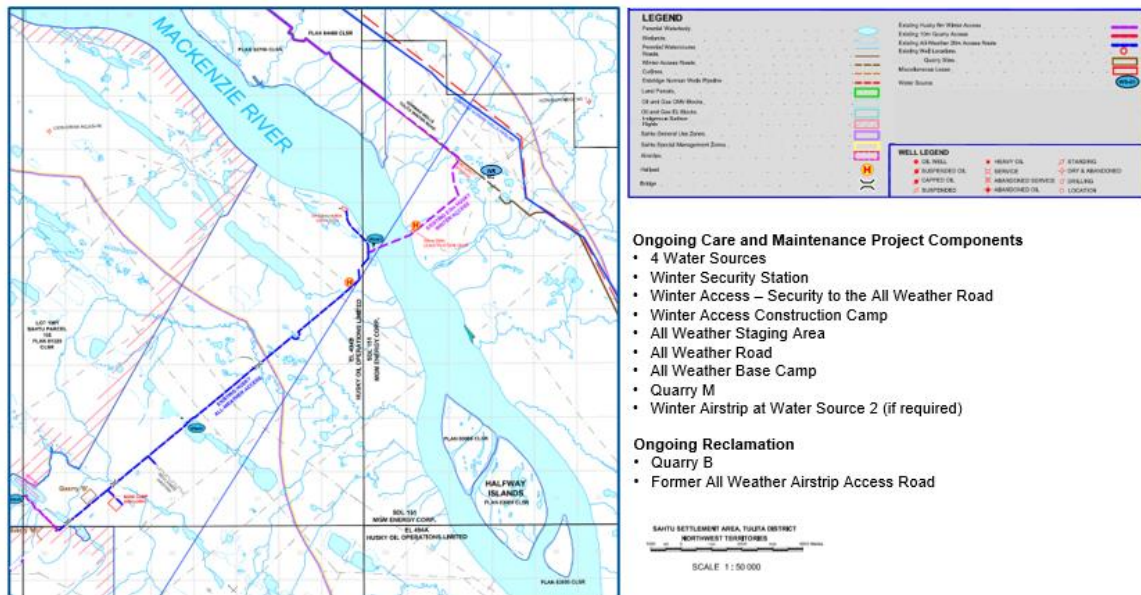

Slater River Assets Held In Ongoing Reclamation and Care & Maintenance



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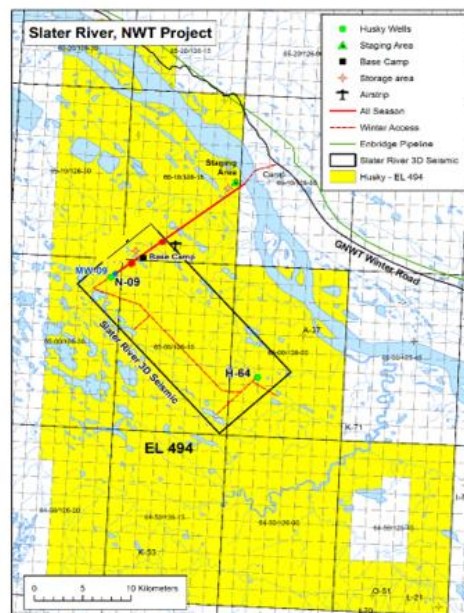
Slater River Project Review

Historical Timeline

- 2011 - Husky awarded EL462 and EL463; consolidated into EL494 in 2013
- 2011 - Conducted environmental baseline studies
- 2012 - Acquired 220 km² of 3D seismic
- 2012/2013 - Drilled, completed and tested two vertical hydrocarbon wells (N-09 & H-64)
- 2013 - Drilled 10 shallow wells (2 water and 8 thermistor) for groundwater monitoring and 2 deeper bedrock water wells
- 2013/2014 - Completed 19 km of all-weather access road
- In 2016 Husky awarded Significant Discovery Declaration (SDD) covering 149,733 hectares

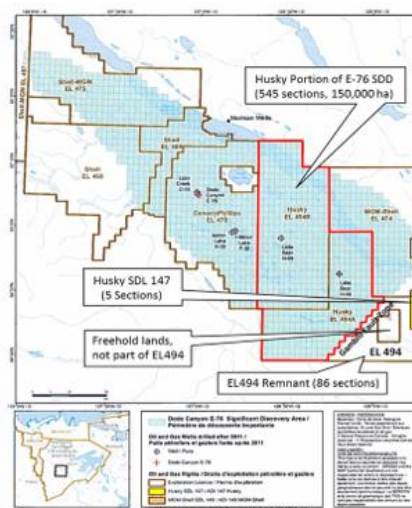
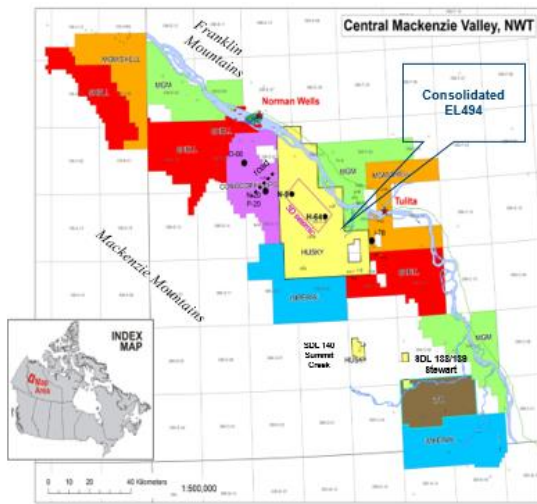
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- In 2018-19 Husky completed the well abandonment program as part of the outstanding work commitment prior to the Significant Discovery License (SDL) being issued

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Slater River 2020-2025 Program

General Scope of Work

Husky will continue with progressive reclamation and care and maintenance activities for Slater River. All proposed activities on the schedule will occur annually over a 5-year time frame.

Husky is proposing to consolidate the remaining Slater River project components requiring further reclamation or future care and maintenance into one Land Use Permit and one Water Licence. Activities in reclaiming or maintaining project components are scheduled annually over the next five years.

There may be a possibility of a two-year extension or renewal.

Reclamation: Return of the previously-used work areas to a natural state or equivalent land use. Implemented when the site and/or project components are no longer needed. Reclaimed areas are anticipated to be inspected over the next 3 to 5 years to ensure stability and vegetative growth is satisfactory.

Care and Maintenance: Keeping infrastructure/project components in an operable state for the life of the program. Requires ongoing monitoring and maintenance and can include installation or repair of rip-rap as well as re-grading or contouring of roads, pad areas, or quarries. Erosion or sediment control measures may be added to, repaired or replaced as required.

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
