Hi Sean,

We filed an application for a land use permit with the Sahtu Land and Water Board. The project is to do some geotechnical drilling along the road alignment from Canyon Creek to Prohibition Creek. We had said in our waste management plan that we would deposit any garbage in the Town's landfill. The waste is expected to be a mix of domestic-type garbage, food scraps, perhaps some cardboard, plastics and other material.

Other possible wastes could be batteries, animal carcasses (in case of any collision) or contaminated soils. It is unlikely that we would need to deposit of any of these materials.

This is a short project and expect waste volumes are going to be very low. I have attached our draft waste management plan. It will not be finalized until after we select a contractor.

We need written confirmation that the Town would accept the solid waste from this project. As you noted, we would contact you prior to any disposal so we can confirm volumes and types of waste and also take pictures of anything we deposit in the landfill.

Please email me back with confirmation that we will be able to use the landfill for this project.
