Credit Lake Fuel Removal

September 24, 2020 and September 25, 2020

Removed 28 full drums of fuel 11 Jet and 5 gas and 12 Diesel
Total weight 11,900 lbs.

Removed 10 partial drums for Misc. Fuel
Total weight 2500 lbs.

Removed 16 Empty Drums
Total weight 880 lbs.

Removed 34 pails of contaminated soil
Total estimated weight 2,240 lbs.

Total weight at 17,520 lbs for fuel and soils returned to Yellowknife. That weight was transported over 6 Twin Otter loads at an average back haul weight load at 2,920 lbs.

Dismantled bear fence around kitchen as was damaged and lots of wire that wildlife could get caught up in. Rolled up and placed near kitchen area.

Repaired a number of holes in a few of the weather haven tents that were damaged likely as a result of wildlife.

All fuel has been removed from site. Please note there is no fuel at site at all. All empties were removed other than three that were tied into the generator building. These were emptied and secured to side of building.

All hard sided buildings were secured and doors were screwed shut and plywood covering over windows.

Removed all 5 gallon buckets of contaminated soil from site (34X 60lb. pails). Dropped off at KBL for disposal with the drums of contaminated fuel. Please note that we were able to give away a number of the diesel drums and that cost savings was then applied to the disposal costs of the contaminated soil that was left at site. There is no additional disposal costs and we were able to remove and dispose of the contaminated soils as land use identified that as an important item to deal with.
