ENGAGEMENT PLAN - W2018C0008

January 2, 2019

The following is the 2019 Engagement Plan for the W2018C0008 renewal application. At present, the project is on care and maintenance but subject to new desktop geological review following the purchase of Peregrine Diamonds Ltd. by De Beers Canada Inc.

Location

The project is located 303 kilometers northeast of Yellowknife (heading 45°), 29 kilometers southeast of Diavik (heading 130°) and approximately nine (9) kilometers east (heading 90°) of the Tibbitt to Contwoyto winter road. Activities are focused on the DO-18 and DO-27 kimberlites and all activities will be based out of the DO-27 Camp (est. circa 2004).

Background

The last field exploration program occurred in March and April of 2012. Since this time, the project has been on *care and maintenance* as Peregrine focuses on other projects in other Canadian jurisdictions. Daytrip camp maintenance activities were carried out at the DO-27 camp in July 2014, August 2015, March 2016, July 2016 to ensure regulatory compliance.

Other activities relating to the care of this project are listed below.

- 1) Maintaining mining leases (desktop work)
- 2) Maintaining land use permits (desktop work)
- 3) Maintaining regulatory compliance (desktop work)
- 4) Geological research (desktop work)
- 5) Monitoring government geoscience initiatives in the area (desktop work)
- 6) Annual consultation update letters (desktop work)

In the future, when the project moves from care and maintenance to active field exploration additional consultation activities will take place. During the interim annual update letters, typically followed by a telephone call will continue.

When will you be engaging?

Care and Maintenance Activities: Annual update letters sent electronically by email will continue for all care and maintenance activities.

Drilling: Any field program that involves drilling will follow the protocol below.

- a) Prior to any drill program a plan regarding the type of drill activities, the approximate locations and approximate timeframe will be sent to the organizations. This will be sent 60 days in advance of any proposed drill program.
- b) A follow-up telephone call will be made to the affected parties to (1) ensure that a drill plan has been received and (2) set up a time for a conference call to discuss the drill plan in detail and any concerns.
- c) Following the conference call, if an affected party deems it necessary, a face to face meeting can be arranged.

What is the purpose for engaging?

The purpose for engaging is to update affected parties on:

- a) Project status
- b) Project activities
- c) Project plans
- d) Identify concerns
- e) Follow-up concerns

Who will be engaged?

At each of the affected parties there is a land manager/policy manager/regulatory manager that is the point of contact for engagement activities. This person is the point of contact for any letters and initial follow-up calls. Further engagement requirements will be discussed with this person.

How will you engage?

Engagement will be done through written correspondence, telephone calls, and face to face meetings when necessary.
