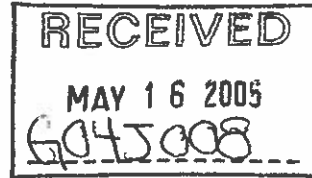

**RE: Final Plan Request: Land Use Permit GO4J008 (Campsite-Sitidgi Lake)**

Dear Mr. Hagen;

As per your letter dated March 14, 2005 I submit the enclosed as a final report of campsite operations:

**Camp Location:** Sitidgi Lake (68 25.094N 132 52.833 W)

**Purpose of Camp:** 20 Day Land Program to teach young adults bush survival, hunting and trapping techniques and life skills.

**Structures Erected:** Six tent frames- 4 sleeping accommodations, 1 kitchen/meeting, 1 storage

**Number of People On Site:** Fourteen- 2 Elders, 1 Cook, 2 Officers, 9 students


**Operations:** See attached curriculum. No trails were cut. Short traplines were established and various routes were taken during hunts for caribou. There was no adverse effects on the land. An outhouse equipped with a honey bucket was established for the camp. All waste was brought back to town and disposed of at the sewage lagoon. Garbage was also hauled back to town and placed at the landfill. There were no spills during occupation of the site. All travel was via snowmachine.

**Demobilization:** All structures have been hauled back to Inuvik. All traps were removed prior to the end of February. The site has been revisited five times since removal of all debris to scan for garbage which may have surfaced from snow melt. The site is now clean from all RWED operations on the land.

I hope this is satisfactory to fulfil the requirements of Section 29 of the MVLUR. Should you require any additional information, feel free to contact me at the number below. Also attached for your information is the spring 2005 GMVF newsletter which discusses the program.
