<b>Item Description:</b>	<p>The Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR) has submitted to the Gwich'in Land and Water Board an application for a Type "A" Land Use Permit, for the purpose of groundwater monitoring well installation at the Transfer Lot and former Bunkhouse Lot in Inuvik, NT. The applicant requests a term of less than one year, with work to begin in 2018.</p> <p>Reviewers are invited to submit questions, comments, and recommendations using the Online Review System (ORS) by the review comment deadline specified below. The Board is not bound by the contents of the draft Permit and will make its decision at the close of the proceeding on the basis of all the evidence and arguments filed by all parties.</p> <p>Also, under the Preliminary Screening Requirement Regulations of the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act (MVRMA), the Board must conduct a preliminary screening for an application for a proposed development that requires a land use permit, unless it is exempt from Part 5 of the MVRMA.</p> <p>Reviewers are encouraged to provide comments and recommendations (e.g. on impacts and mitigation measures) to assist with the completion of the preliminary screening.</p> <p>Please be advised that comments made by reviewers regarding impacts of this project to wildlife and wildlife habitat in this preliminary screening will inform the GNWT Minister of Environment and Natural Resources' determination regarding whether a Wildlife Management and Monitoring Plan will be required for this project as per Section 95 of the Wildlife Act.</p>

As the ground surface will be disturbed, there is a chance for archaeological materials to be inadvertently disturbed as well. <b>Recommendation</b> The DCH requests that if a monitor will be hired, it should be someone who is familiar with archaeological remains so they can check the backdirt piles to identify archaeological artifacts. As with any application, if archaeological or heritage materials are encountered during the development within the Gwich'in Settlement Area all work must cease immediately as required by law, and the DCH and the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre in Yellowknife must then be contacted.
