Good evening,

We are responding to the Giant Mine Remediation Project's November 15, 2019 response to compensation claims. As we are not in a position to provide a comprehensive response to the GMRP's submission, we are re-iterating a few key points from our October 18, 2019 claim.

In our claim we noted that the Applicant had made preliminary, albeit encouraging, proposals regarding the construction of a boat launch at or near the current location of the Great Slave Sailing Club, and that we looked forward to further discussions with the Applicant. We provided a copy of our claim to the Applicant on October 18, 2019, and indicated that we would be pleased to meet with the Applicant, ideally via a group meeting, to discuss further details of the proposed boat launch (see attached). The Applicant has not communicated directly with us since October 18, and the Applicant's November 15 response indicates (page 4) that the most recent engagement with the Great Slave Sailing Club was on September 19, 2019.

We are disappointed in the recent lack of engagement on the part of the Applicant, and believe that the Applicant's approach may not be consistent with the developer's commitments from Environmental Assessment EA0809-001 and the intent of the *Land and Water Boards' Engagement Guidelines for Applicants and Holders of Water Licences and Land Use Permits*.

We urge the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board to make full use of the process tools available to it to compel the Applicant to engage appropriately with all stakeholders, including recreational boaters, during the water licensing process and after the licence is issued. As stated in our claim, we understand and support the need for remediation of the Giant Mine site and are not seeking to obstruct the remediation work. We look forward to productive discussions with the Applicant and will follow, with interest, the remaining steps of the water licensing process.
