I am writing in response to the Giant Mine Remediation Team (GMRT) letter of November 15, 2019 to myself and host of other applicants who put forward legitimate claims on the Giant Mine remediation project.

I must admit that I'm disappointed in the response offered by the Giant Mine Remediation Team. I'm not sure how it can be stated, with certainty, that recreational boaters are not eligible for compensation. The clear fact is that we, like so many other boaters, will be forced to find alternative, and costly, methods of launching and retrieving boats. These expensive, alternative approaches are a direct result of the Giant Mine dock closing; and the closing of the Giant mine dock is a requirement of the remediation project. As a result, boaters like us, and others, are most certainly impacted by the project. Based on the spirit and intent of the legislation, impacted users should not be forced to absorb additional costs because of clean-up activities.

Possibly even more disappointing however, are the heavy handed arguments being put forward by the GMRT and CIRNAC. Clearly the arguments raised in the letter were developed by federal legal counsel. It is unfortunate that individuals and non profits don't have access to the same level of supports. This is a point that was raised in my November 26 email to the board. Despite suggestions to provide funding to individuals and non-profit organizations as a way to 'level the playing field', the request was denied.

That same email also proposed another alternative – one that would see the entire compensation review and assessment process 'paused' until details can be finalized on a [solution to the problem](#). That solution would see the development of a second launch ramp at the Great Slave Sail Club as part of that site's remediation. This pragmatic, creative and cost-effective solution would provide for unencumbered access to a launch facility throughout all remediation activities. The concept enjoys the support of all parties and was committed to by the GMRT in their letter of October 10/19 to the City of Yellowknife. The fact that the GMRT is willing to work with the other parties to find a mutually agreeable solution to the problem speaks to the reality that recreational boaters will be impacted in a significant and negative manner.

At this time, the solution requires only that an Access Agreement be finalized between the City, GNWT and the GMRT and a subsequent extension of the GSSC sublease on their current site. Once these final boxes are checked-off, most if not all of the compensation claims can be withdrawn. As outlined in my November 26/19 email, I am not sure why we are forcing an answer on the issue of compensation when a plausible solution to access issues and compensation claims, is so close to being realized.

I would respectfully request that the Board rethink its original position on these items and give the solution being worked on by all impacted parties every opportunity to be put in place. Until such time as an alternative launch site to Great Slave Lake is available however, our only option is to keep our compensation claim in place.

Dear Evan and Ian,

In response to your emails of November 26, 2019 requesting additional time for Claimants to provide responses to the review of their Claims for Water Compensation as submitted by the Giant Mine Remediation Project Team (GMRP) on November 15, 2019, the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB, or the Board) will provide an **extension until December 13, 2019**. Please note that a response to GMRP must be filed by that date. If you are continuing the effort to negotiate a settlement the same deadline applies.

Throughout the water compensation process the Board has maintained procedural fairness via the granting of numerous extensions to timelines for both the Claimants and GMRP. We wish to note, however, that while there are no legislated timelines specific to water compensation, the Board cannot make a decision on the issuance of the water licence for the remediation of the Giant Mine site until it is satisfied that any claims for water compensation have been addressed. The Board is bound by a 9-month legislated timeline during which it must make a decision on a water licence application. In the case of the Giant Mine proceeding, that time is running out.

The Board provided overview documents about the water compensation process in June and August this past summer (attached). At that time, it was noted that the compensation regime is a legal process and that consulting with counsel would assist with fully understanding the legislation and requirements.

To the request that funding be provided to the Claimants to assist with the hiring of legal counsel, the MVLWB has no means to provide participant funding for its proceedings.

For clarity, the deadline for all Claimants to submit responses to the GMRP's review of the Claims for Water Compensation has been **extended to December 13, 2019**.

Shannon/Shelagh et al,

It is unlikely that a small, non-profit society such as ours will be able to respond to such legal arguments without seeking professional legal assistance. Such legal assistance costs money; money that a small, non-profit group simply doesn't have. I'm sure the Board and the federal government are aware of this, but I wanted to remind everyone of that important fact.

Given the above reality, I see two options on how we might proceed:

1) we seek funding from the Giant team and/or the Board to engage a local legal firm and review the arguments being put forward in the Nov. 15/19 letter from the Giant team and develop a response. This is likely to take some time as we will need to secure funding, acquire legal counsel, and provide them sufficient time to undertake a thorough review of the arguments being put forward; or

2) we ask the Board to 'pause' the deadline on responding to the Nov. 15/19 letter from the Giant team.

Given that we have been working towards a solution that would see unobstructed access to a launch facility, and that progress (however slow) is being made on that front, I would suggest the board consider option #2 above. The fact is that if an alternative launch site is developed and unobstructed access becomes a reality, the majority of compensation claims will likely be withdrawn.

I ask the Board and the Giant Team - why would we force a decision on compensation claims when we don't even know how many claims are needed? As outlined above, doing so will only cost all parties money and time. Wouldn't it be better for us to focus our efforts, resources and time on realizing the alternate launch solution and avoiding (or at least minimizing) the number/value of compensation claims, legal expenditures, etc. etc.?

I would urge the Board to pause the timeline on responding to the Nov. 15/19 letter from the Giant Mine team until such time as we know whether or not an alternative launch site will be developed.
