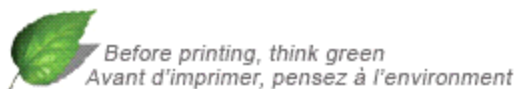

Hi,

The City of Yellowknife has been requested to disconnect a water line for the Giant Mine Remediation Project (GMRP) in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories. The GMRP is being managed by the Government of Canada.

The City was given a completion date of January 2021. The City cannot guarantee that the ice will be safe to work on at that time, so the work needs to be completed prior to freeze up.

The work entails sending a dive crew to the section of pipe that needs to be disconnected. The couplings will be unbolted and the pipe severed as required by Canada. However, this work may cause some sediment to be disturbed. We do not anticipate this to be a large disturbance at all but we wanted to ensure that we are notifying all authorities of the work. We can provide a more formal work plan if requested, but I was directed to this email address by the local Yellowknife DFO

Office.

I apologize for the urgency associated with this request and would be grateful for any assistance that can be provided.
