FACILITY DESCRIPTION

Facility – A re-established DO-27 Project camp (*Map 2*¹) will consist of 4 sleep tents to house 16 personnel, a medic tent and common buildings comprised of an office, kitchen, dry, generator shed, storage shed/water-tank shed, Pacto toilet shed and, if required, a rec tent.¹ The existing fuel berm north of camp will be restocked¹ with 205L drums of diesel, Jet-B and petrol/gasoline.

Location – Lac de Gras Project Camp is located at: 64° 34' 08.30" N lat. – 110° 54' 55.30" W long. in NTS sheet 76D/10. DO-27 Project Camp, which will be used in 2012,² is located at: 64° 19' 00" N lat. – 109° 48' 00" W long. in NTS sheet 76C/05. Fuel at DO-27 camp will be stored in an existing berm 150m NW of the camp compound and approx. 210m E of DO-27 Lake¹.
