From the correspondence below, I understand that for federal projects, the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development should be used as the correct reference for legal documents, and Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada should be used for general correspondence. Recently, it was noted that Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada was listed as an applicant (for [LUP Application MV2016S0016](#)), but should it be the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development? The proponent's name is copied from what is listed on the application form, so we want to ensure that we use the correct legal name for the permit (and for other permits and licences moving forward).
