**Information Request #2 – Outstanding Information
Line 21 Segment Replacement Project, Fort Simpson, NT**

By May 15, 2017, the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB or Board) staff received Liidlii Kue First Nation's (LKFN) comments and recommendations on the Water Licence (Licence) MV2017L1-0002 and Land Use Permit MV2017P0013 Applications submitted by Enbridge Pipelines Inc. (Enbridge) in support of conducting off right-of-way activities for replacement of a segment of the Norman Wells (Line 21) pipeline from Norman Wells, NT to the Alberta/Northwest Territories border near Fort Simpson, NT. Several LKFN comments and recommendations included references to the need to be compensated.

Please confirm by **Tuesday, June 20, 2017** if LKFN intends to submit a claim for compensation under the *Waters Act*.

The following points are key to a claim for compensation under the *Waters Act*:

- A water compensation claim must be based on the effects of a licensee's water use and waste deposit, as authorized by a Licence.
- The onus is on a claimant to prove they qualify for compensation within the *Waters Act* framework.
- The onus is on a claimant to quantify the amount and form that compensation should take.
- Claims for past adverse effects cannot be considered.
- If a qualifying compensation claim is advanced, the Board will make a decision on that claim before a Licence is issued.
