**Directive to Parties on the Reconvening of the Public Hearing (January 8-9, 2018)  
Enbridge Pipelines (NW) Inc. Line 21 Segment Replacement Project**

On October 27-28, 2017, the Public Hearing for Land Use Permit Application MV2017P0013 and Water Licence Application MV2017L1-0002 began in Fort Simpson, NT. The Public Hearing was adjourned at that time and is scheduled to reconvene in Fort Simpson on January 8-9, 2018. The schedule of the reconvened Public Hearing is expected to be as follows:

January 8, 2018 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM and 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM (public session)  
January 9, 2018 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM

To prepare for the reconvened Public Hearing, the Board issues the following Directive to the Parties (Applicant and Interveners):

- 1. Scope of Activities as Considered by the MVLWB (off the Right of Way):** The off Right of Way activities listed below are within the scope of the Board's jurisdiction. As such, the Board requests that Parties focus their comments, questions, and recommendations during the Public Hearing on these activities and the draft Land Use Permit and Water Licence conditions.

Site Clearing

- Improvements to the shoofly access on the north shore
- Clearing of vegetation for camps, staging/laydown storage, well sites, camps, barge landing, sumps, and south and north work sites, where necessary

Mobilization of Equipment

- Transportation and set up of drill and supporting equipment

The Use of Water

- Drilling fluid make-up water
- Hydrostatic testing

Horizontal Directional Drilling

- on South Work Site (proposed exit)

Site Restoration

- Restoration of surface grades and drainages
- Backfill of excavations
- Roll back of brush and peat over disturbed areas
- Remediation of the north shore shoofly access and the north shore barge landing
- Installation of erosion and sediment controls

Demobilization

- Demobilization of drilling and supporting equipment at the North and South Work Sites and all camp infrastructure

Water Discharge

- Pump-off discharge (to land) of: ponded surface water (if required), hydrostatic test water, separated water from drilling fluid, unused stored water (if required)

Drilling mud, drill fluid and drill cuttings storage and disposal

- Spent drill fluid and/or cuttings disposal sumps to be located off Right of Way

Camp setup and operation

- Camps set up off of the Right of Way

Waste storage

- Temporary waste storage off the Right of Way prior to offsite disposal, e.g., domestic wastes, cleared vegetation

Fuel Storage

- Fuel stored on and/or off the Right of Way, depending on the final layout of the drill and supporting equipment at the North and South Work Sites

**2. Order of Presentations:** Presentations made at the reconvened Public Hearing will follow the order listed below:

1. Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT)
2. Dehcho First Nations (DFN)
3. Sambaa K'e First Nation (SKFN)
4. Liidlii Kue First Nation (LKFN)

Parties (including the Applicant) will be able to ask questions following the presentations, for a total of 30 minutes per Party per round of questions. The Board will not consider any new evidence in advance of, or during, the reconvened Public Hearing.

**3. Closing Arguments:** Closing Arguments made to the Board will be oral statements made at the reconvened Public Hearing (that is, not delivered in writing, electronically, or by other means). Closing Arguments are expected to conclude Day 2 of the Hearing. Parties shall limit their Closing Arguments to five (5) minutes. As with the presentations in (2) above, no new evidence is to be presented to the Board during Closing Arguments.

**4. Work Plan:** The external Work Plan, which outlines the events for the Public Hearing, any subsequent actions, and the deadlines for events and deliverables, has been updated. For details, please refer to the updated Work Plan attached to this Directive.

**MVLWB Work Plan for Enbridge Pipelines (NW) Inc. – Updated November 14, 2017**  
**March 2017 Applications**  
**Water Licence MV2017L1-0002**  
**Land Use Permit MV2017P0013**

**Purpose of the Work Plan**

This Work Plan was updated from the version dated October 12, 2017. It outlines the processes and timelines to be followed for the March 2017 Applications for Water Licence (Licence) MV2017L1-0002 and Land Use Permit (Permit) MV2017P0013 for Enbridge Pipelines (NW) Inc. (Enbridge) Line 21 Segment Replacement Project (Project). The first portion of the Public Hearing was held in Fort Simpson on October 27 – 28, 2017. This updated Work Plan reflects the reconvening of the Public Hearing, which is scheduled for January 8 – 9, 2018. A table containing the updated timeline is on page 4 of this document.

**Background**

Enbridge submitted Applications for a Permit (MV2017P0013) and a Licence (MV2017L1-0002) on March 23, 2017 to conduct off Right of Way (RoW) activities for the maintenance of the Norman Wells (Line 21) pipeline from Norman Wells, NT to the Alberta/Northwest Territories border near Fort Simpson, NT.

The existing Line 21 pipeline extends from Norman Wells, NT to Zama, Alberta, a total length of 869 km. In 2016, through regular maintenance and inspection, increased rates of slope movement were identified near the Mackenzie River crossing, approximately 9 km east of Fort Simpson, NT. In order to protect the pipeline from the impacts of further slope movement, and to support continued safe operation of the pipeline, Enbridge is proposing to replace a segment of the existing pipeline under the Mackenzie River. The Project includes installation of up to 2500 meters of new pipeline below the Mackenzie River, using a Horizontal Directional Drilling method. The existing segment of pipe will be decommissioned in place.

On March 10, 2017, Enbridge filed applications with the National Energy Board (NEB) as follows:

- An application to install the new segment of pipe, pursuant to section 58 of the *National Energy Board Act*; and
- An application to decommission the existing segment of pipe, pursuant to section 45.1 of the Onshore Pipeline Regulations.

The first part of the Public Hearing was held in Fort Simpson on October 27 – 28, 2017. The Public Hearing will be reconvened in Fort Simpson on January 8 – 9, 2018.

## Scope of Activities as Considered by MVLWB (off the Right of Way)

### Site Clearing:

- Improvements to the shoofly access on the north shore
- Clearing of vegetation for camps, staging/laydown storage, well sites, camps, barge landing, sumps, and south and north work sites, where necessary

### Mobilization of Equipment:

- transportation and set up drill and supporting equipment

### The Use of Water:

- For drilling fluid make-up water and hydrostatic testing

### Horizontal Directional Drilling:

- On South Work Site (proposed exit)

### Site Restoration:

- Surface grades and drainages will be restored
- Excavations will be backfilled
- Brushing and peat will be rolled back over disturbed
- The north shore shoofly access and the north shore barge landing will be remediated
- Erosion and sediment controls will be installed

### Demobilization:

- Demobilization of drilling and supporting equipment at the North and South Work Sites and all camp infrastructure

### Water Discharge

- Pump-off discharge (to land) of: ponded surface water (if required), hydrostatic test water, separated water from drilling fluid, unused stored water (if required)

### Drilling mud, drill fluid and drill cuttings storage and disposal

- Spent drill fluid and/or cuttings disposal sumps to be located off Right of Way

### Camp setup and operation

- Camps will be setup off the RoW

### Waste storage

- Some wastes may be temporarily stored off the RoW prior to offsite disposal, e.g., domestic wastes, cleared vegetation

### Fuel Storage

- Depending on the final layout of the drill and supporting equipment at the North and South Work Sites, fuel may be stored on and/or off the RoW.

## Activities as Considered by the NEB

The NEB set out information regarding the scope of the activities considered by it in Hearing Order MH-001-2017, released by the NEB on May 18, 2017. The Hearing Order can be found on the NEB's public registry under filing number: [A83697-6](#). The NEB also released a continuation letter of the oral process on August 17, 2017 under filing number: [A85536-1](#). The NEB held its Public Hearing in Fort Simpson on October 23-26, 2017.

## Guiding Principles

The following principles guide the Work Plan of the MVLWB throughout this licensing and permitting process:

- The process shall be carried out in a timely manner and shall have regard to the protection of the environment in consideration of the impacts of the proposed undertaking and the importance of conservation to the wellbeing and way of life of the Aboriginal peoples of Canada (Section 35 of the *Constitution Act*, 1982);

- The Board will review Enbridge's March 2017 Applications and consider potential Licence and Permit conditions based on the evidence and rationale submitted by the company or any other party; and
- The Board will review Enbridge's March 2017 Applications and consider potential Licence and Permit conditions in order to meet the Board's mandate and applicable policies and to ensure consistency in decision-making throughout the Mackenzie Valley.

### **Work Plan Objectives**

The Work Plan is to achieve the following objectives:

- Compile a broad range of input through the review process;
- Ensure adequate information is gathered to complete the Licence and Permit process;
- Facilitate a thorough, inclusive, and timely Licence and Permit review process; and
- Establish appropriate Licence and Permit conditions to ensure protection of the environment.

### **Opportunities for Community Engagement**

- The Board's *Engagement and Consultation Policy* and *Engagement Guidelines for Applicants and Holders of Water Licences and Land Use Permits* requires Enbridge to engage with communities and Aboriginal organizations regarding the Licence and Permit Applications prior to their submission;
- The Board has distributed the Applications to various parties, including Aboriginal organizations, governments, and communities, for review using the LWB Online Review System;
- The Board will include a notification(s) regarding the review process for these Applications in the newspaper;
- The Board held a Public Hearing in Fort Simpson on October 27-28, 2017 and will reconvene its Hearing on January 8-9, 2018; and
- The Board will hold any other consultation or engagement activity that the Board considers appropriate.

### **Materials Circulated for Comment by Parties**

During the course of these proceedings, Board staff will review all evidence filed by the parties. These efforts are intended to identify issues or concerns which must be addressed in the Licence and Permit and to resolve them, if possible, before the close of the proceedings. In order to focus these discussions, staff will update and re-circulate a draft of the Licence and Permit for comment. This process allows parties to address the proposed terms and conditions for the Licence and Permit in their presentations to the Board and to prepare arguments setting out their positions with respect to these provisions at the close of the proceedings.

These staff efforts to develop and circulate a draft Licence and Permit should focus discussion on appropriate terms and conditions for these authorizations. The Board is not bound by the contents of any of these draft materials and will make its decision at the close of the proceedings on the basis of all the evidence and arguments filed by all parties.
