The information required for this report, as specified by Land Use Permit MV2020P006 Part C Condition 9, is provided below.

a. A summary of off right-of-way activities undertaken and locations used for those activities;

For the reporting year May 2020 to April 2021, Enbridge required occasional use of off right-of-way (ROW) access trails and shoo-flies. The trails, camps, and shoo-flies that were utilized during the reporting period are summarized in Appendix A (below).

Enbridge also maintained the fireguards surrounding remote valve sites and facilities as required.

b. Waste audit (detailing types, volumes and ultimate disposal location)

No wastes were generated or disposed of as a result of activities on land use permitted areas during the reporting period.

c. A report on the volume of quarry materials removed from borrow sites;

No quarry materials were removed from permitted borrow sites during the reporting period.

d. A summary of all activities carried out under the Engagement Plan.

Enbridge continues to be guided by the *Enbridge Pipelines (NW) Inc., Line 21 Land Use Permit Renewal Application, Indigenous and Community Engagement Plan, November 2019* (Engagement Plan) on file with the MVLWB. Enbridge is not aware of any outstanding concerns relating to use of off right-of-way access trails or any other land use permitted activities. A summary of engagement activities undertaken by Enbridge during the reporting period is provided below:

- Due to the ongoing pandemic, Enbridge has primarily engaged via a virtual platform 2020 and 2021. We will continually strive for in person engagement as the pandemic moves ahead, restrictions are eased, and when there is an overwhelming level of comfort for all Parties involved in the engagements. In 2020 and 2021, Enbridge formally engaged with several local and Indigenous groups along Line 21 regarding the general operation; operational and maintenance activities; reclamation activities; small projects; corporate COVID-19 mitigations; community investment funding opportunities; summer student job opportunities; local business information updates; business opportunities in general; and to communicate Enbridge's Public Awareness Program.
- Formal engagement occurred in 2020 and 2021 with several local and Indigenous groups along Line 21 to discuss the Little Smith Creek Maintenance Project (KP 158), Line 21 Integrity Dig program and Line 21 operational and maintenance work. Engagement was to notify of the planned work; receive input to optimize local inclusion; and to listen / implement input related to concerns over contracting and the ongoing pandemic. Local input related to Enbridge's approach to COVID-19 mitigations was instrumental in preventing any transmissions of the virus on our worksites.
- Enbridge formally engaged on all matters of interest virtually in Q4 2020; and is planning to do so again in Q2 2021. At minimum, local and Indigenous groups include those listed below. Other groups such as emergency responders are not listed. Local and Indigenous groups in proximity to Line 21 and located in Alberta are not listed.
