



Line 21 Land Use Permit Renewal Application

Community and Indigenous Engagement Summary

Enbridge has been engaging with local Indigenous groups and stakeholders (“affected parties”) for many decades in the region regarding various pipeline projects and ongoing maintenance activities. Enbridge values the relationships that have been built over many years of listening, learning and working together in the region.

Enbridge engaged with affected parties regarding its intent to renew its operational Land Use Permit (“LUP”) in 2020, a process that has occurred several times since 1985. Since the fall of 2018, Enbridge has been providing affected parties with information about the current LUP and the renewal application (the “Application”) with the goal of initiating early and ongoing dialogue, and to listen and respond to any interests and concerns regarding the Application in a timely manner.

A detailed summary of the engagement program follows. A full engagement record is provided as Schedule A.

Engagement Objectives

Enbridge is committed to creating processes that support meaningful engagement with potentially affected parties. Enbridge works to build an understanding of community interests, ensure regulatory requirements are met, mitigate or avoid potential operational and maintenance effects if applicable, and provide socioeconomic opportunities to the communities in which Enbridge operates.

The objectives for undertaking engagement for the Application include the following:

- Ensure the procedural aspects of the duty to consult that are delegated to Enbridge are met and all regulatory requirements for consultation and engagement have been achieved.
- Build and maintain positive long-term relationships with Indigenous and local communities.
- Ensure consultation and engagement activities are coordinated and aligned with other regional community engagement activities.
- Contribute and align with the Regional Engagement Plan and Enbridge’s Indigenous Engagement Policy <http://www.enbridge.com/about-us/indigenous-communities/indigenous-peoples-policy>.

These objectives will be achieved by undertaking the following steps:

- Identify Indigenous groups and stakeholders with interests in the area related to Enbridge’s operational LUP.
- Inform potentially affected Indigenous groups and stakeholders by sharing information on the LUP and the Application in a clear and timely manner.
- Create opportunities for meaningful engagement as early as possible in the LUP renewal process and advise affected parties of their opportunities to communicate with the regulator.
- Understand and respond to any issues or concerns in an effort to resolve or mitigate those issues or concerns.



- Maintain ongoing communications with potentially affected parties throughout the development of the Application with a view to continued long-term relationship building required for the operation of the facilities.
- Develop and submit a record of engagement and an engagement plan in accordance with the MVLWB Engagement Guidelines for Applicants and Holders of Water Licenses and Land Use Permits, adopted by the Sahtu Land and Water Board (“SLWB”).

Design of the Community and Indigenous Engagement Program

Early introduction of the LUP renewal process began in late 2018 when Enbridge initiated discussions with potentially affected parties. At this time, information focused on notifying communities about the renewal timeline, what is included in Enbridge’s current LUP, reasons for applying for renewal, and soliciting feedback on how potentially affected parties wished to be engaged.

While Enbridge engages regularly with local communities where Line 21 operates, a specific Community and Indigenous Engagement Plan was developed and implemented for the Application (provided as Schedule B). The information presented in this section of the Application reflects Enbridge’s engagement activities from late 2018 to April 2020 specific to the LUP renewal; however, engagement will continue throughout the life of Enbridge’s operations in the area.

Using the MVLWB’s Engagement Guidelines (adopted by the SLWB) to align its engagement efforts, Enbridge conducted communication and outreach activities with potentially affected parties. Enbridge’s engagement efforts ensure that potentially affected parties:

- Develop an understanding of the LUP renewal process and components of the LUP through early and ongoing dialogue.
- Provide feedback to Enbridge on issues of concern so that Enbridge is better informed and can address issues early on.
- Work towards building and maintaining long-term relationships in the area.

The engagement program has involved, and will continue to involve, outreach methods including:

- Letter mail outs of information and follow-up updates;
- In-person meetings;
- Phone calls and email correspondence;
- Factsheets and newsletter; and
- Community presentations.

Identification of Potentially Affected Parties

Potentially affected parties have been identified based on long-standing relationships developed over more than thirty years of Enbridge’s history in the Dehcho and Sahtu regions and through consultation with local communities.

Environmental Management Agreement – Dehcho Region

Enbridge has entered into an Environmental Management Agreement (“EMA”) with the Dehcho region Indigenous communities. An Environmental Management Committee (“EMC”) was formed in 2018 with representation from each of the Dehcho communities and Enbridge. The EMA sets out the intention of the parties to work together in a collaborative and respectful relationship regarding Line 21 activities for the life of Line 21 operations. Under the EMA, communication protocols exist surrounding information sharing about Line 21 activities and regulatory applications and provides a mechanism for Dehcho communities to review pending or expected regulatory applications.

The Application has been discussed several times with the EMC communities, as outlined in the engagement record. In March 2020, Enbridge provided notification to the EMC of its intention to submit the Application and provided a copy of the EMC’s engagement and interests record for review prior to submission. An engagement summary factsheet was also provided (Schedule C). A meeting was scheduled with the EMC on April 1, 2020 to discuss any outstanding questions.

Traditional Environmental Knowledge

To support a greater understanding of the land related to its operational LUP, Enbridge commissioned a Traditional Environmental Knowledge (“TEK”) study in November 2013 to support the previous LUP renewal application. The study identified traditionally important land use features associated with the Line 21 pipeline in the Dehcho and Sahtu regions of the Northwest Territories.

Indigenous groups potentially affected by the land use features included under the LUP, and activities conducted on these lands, were contacted for participation in the TEK study. They include:

The information collected was compiled into a comprehensive TEK summary report for the impacted regions. The information provided from the TEK report continues to inform and guide Enbridge's continuing operations in the region.

Summary of Engagement Program Activities

In October 2018, Enbridge held community dinners in Fort Simpson, Norman Wells and Tulita to continue to build and maintain relationships in the area. A presentation provided initial information related to the operational LUP renewal, as well as other maintenance and operational projects in the area.

In February 2019, formal notification letters were sent to affected parties that provided information about the LUP, the Application and Enbridge's plans to draft a Community and Indigenous Engagement Plan specific to the Application.

In April 2019, Enbridge reached out to set up in-person meetings with several potentially affected parties to review the LUP renewal, solicit feedback into the draft engagement plan and answer any questions. Copies of the first draft of the engagement plan were on hand during the meetings for discussion.

A follow-up letter was sent out in May 2019 to thank individual parties for meeting to discuss the renewal process, and again provide information about the Application to all potentially affected parties.

In July 2019, Enbridge followed up with potentially affected parties and provided a copy of the Community and Indigenous Engagement Plan, a "quick reference guide" about the LUP and process for renewal, and additional communication materials related to pipeline safety. Potentially affected parties were asked to contact Enbridge with any questions or concerns.

In November 2019, Enbridge again set out to schedule in-person meetings with potentially affected parties regarding the Application. Meetings occurred with multiple groups to address any outstanding questions.

Further outreach occurred in March and April 2020 to conduct follow-up on action items, provide engagement records for review, and offer to meet with any interested parties prior to Application submission.



Over the course of the last year, Enbridge has held in-person meetings with representatives of the following groups regarding the Application to exchange information, facilitate dialogue on matters of interest or concern including agreements and socio-economic benefits and discuss culturally sensitive or traditional uses currently being performed in the LUP areas.

Community and Indigenous Engagement Plan

A copy the Community and Indigenous Engagement Plan (Schedule B) was shared with potentially affected parties either in person in April 2019, and/or provided by email in July 2019 with a request for any changes or feedback. No changes were requested or received.

Ongoing/Upcoming Engagement Activities

Enbridge will continue to engage with potentially affected parties regarding this LUP or any other operational or maintenance activities. Enbridge representatives have been planning to conduct community visits in Q2 2020 to provide information regarding public awareness, pipeline integrity and land-use activities on and off the right-of-way. In lieu of face-to-face meetings, Enbridge is always willing to engage through teleconference meetings or other preferred means of the community.

1. Introduction

Enbridge operates Line 21 (the Norman Wells Pipeline), which carries crude oil 870 kilometres (km) from Norman Wells, Northwest Territories to Zama, Alberta, where it enters a third-party pipeline system and is sent on to Edmonton. The 12-inch-diameter pipeline travels approximately 750 km through the Northwest Territories and has operated since 1985 with an ongoing land use permit. Enbridge pipeline assets in the Northwest Territories include pump stations and related facilities at Norman Wells, Wrigley, and Mackenzie.

In 2020, Enbridge will reapply for the Line 21 Pipeline Off Right-of Way Operations and Maintenance Land Use Permit (LUP). Enbridge's current LUP was issued by the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB) in 2013 and will expire in July 2020. This renewal process has occurred several times since 1985. To ensure there is an uninterrupted and continued high-level of oversight and diligence in operational and maintenance activities to protect people and the environment, Enbridge will apply for renewal in early 2020 prior to the expiry of its current permit (MV2013P0011).

The LUP allows Enbridge to conduct off right-of-way operational activities for the operation and maintenance of the pipeline from Norman Wells to the Alberta/Northwest Territories border. Those activities include:

- Clearing and maintenance of workspace and fireguard areas;
- Seasonal access trails and shoo flies;
- Temporary camps;
- Fuel and hazardous material storage;
- Borrow sites; and
- An airstrip.

There will be no new land use areas or activities proposed in the LUP renewal application.

This Indigenous and Community Engagement plan outlines the engagement and communication activities that Enbridge will undertake with potentially affected parties in advance of the permit renewal application.

2. Potentially Affected Parties

Potentially affected stakeholders and Indigenous groups were identified based on long-standing relationships developed over more than thirty years of Enbridge's history in the region, as well as the MVLWB's stakeholder distribution list. Appropriate levels of engagement were identified for the following:

3. Engagement

3.1 Approach to Engagement

Enbridge is committed to creating processes that support meaningful engagement with potentially affected Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties. Enbridge works to build an understanding of interests, ensure regulatory requirements are met, mitigate or avoid operational and maintenance effects if applicable, and provide socioeconomic opportunities to local communities.

The Indigenous and Community Engagement (ICE) program for the LUP renewal application has been developed based on regulatory guidelines (including the MVLWB's Engagement Guidelines), Enbridge's [Corporate Social Responsibility Policy](#), and Enbridge's [Indigenous Peoples Policy](#) (available online at www.enbridge.com).

Enbridge's Corporate Social Responsibility ("CSR") Policy states that:

- Enbridge will engage stakeholders clearly, honestly, and respectfully.
- Enbridge is committed to timely and meaningful dialogue with all stakeholders, including

shareholders, customers, and employees, Indigenous peoples, governments, regulators, and landowners, among others.

Engagement is an important aspect of operating within Indigenous lands. Enbridge will engage with Indigenous groups throughout the renewal application period associated with the LUP. Enbridge's goal will be to build a solid understanding of the LUP by sharing relevant information with Indigenous groups. Enbridge will meet this goal by:

- Seeking to understand and respond to any issues or concerns in an effort to resolve or mitigate those issues or concerns;
- Providing timely information and ample opportunity for Indigenous groups to review information, and meet with interested parties to discuss any questions or concerns;
- Meaningful engagement in the development, implementation, management, monitoring and evaluation of ongoing operational activities to prevent or mitigate adverse environmental effects;
- Establish and confirm mechanisms for ongoing communication about Enbridge's operational and maintenance activities; and
- Confirm mechanisms for the ongoing collection of interests and issue resolution from potentially impacted Indigenous groups.

To support Enbridge's ongoing engagement efforts, Enbridge will:

- Incorporate a commitment tracker to ensure all commitments made to potentially affected parties are followed through upon;
- Notify of unplanned events associated with off ROW activities that may impact traditional or contemporary use of the land;
- Establish a process for reviewing and, if necessary, updating the engagement plan;
- Provide funding to support engagement activities as required;
- Work with potentially affected Indigenous groups to identify employment and business opportunities; and
- Develop a mechanism for local First Nations to communicate any concerns about the conduct of Enbridge personnel or contractors involved in operational activities.

3.2 Engagement Activities

Enbridge has been engaging with Indigenous groups and interested parties in the Dehcho and Sahtu regions since Line 21 started operations in 1985 and will continue to engage as long as Enbridge is operating in the area. Enbridge will actively work to identify opportunities for socioeconomic benefits such as business, training and employment opportunities within the regions, and seek to understand community needs in order to support initiatives that are important to the communities.

3.2.1 Initiating Dialogue

In the fall 2018, Enbridge held a community feast in Tulita and met with a number of Indigenous groups and interested parties to continue to build and maintain relationships in the area. High-level information and introductions were provided regarding the LUP renewal application. Subsequently in the fall 2018, Enbridge met with the following groups in the Sahtu Region to discuss a number of items, including the LUP. Groups participating in this engagement were:

- Fort Norman Métis Land & Financial Corporation
- Hamlet of Tulita
- Norman Wells Land Corporation
- Norman Wells Renewable Resource Council
- Town of Norman Wells
- Tulita Land Corporation
- Tulita Dene Band
- Tulita District Land Corporation
- Norman Wells Land Corporation
- Tulita Renewable Resources Council

In February 2019, Enbridge provided an early notification letter to Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties regarding the Line 21 LUP renewal application. The letter advised Enbridge's current LUP issued by MVLWB would expire in 2020 and stated Enbridge's intent to reapply. The letter noted there would be no new land use areas or activities proposed in the LUP renewal application. Enbridge inquired about engagement preferences and indicated that a CIE engagement plan was being drafted. Enbridge advised that a copy of the draft plan could be provided to interested parties and that Enbridge was interested in meeting in person to discuss the LUP.

3.2.2 Pre-Renewal Application Engagement

In the spring 2019, Enbridge provided an update to Indigenous groups and potentially affected stakeholders regarding the LUP renewal process. Meetings occurred with a number of groups and a draft CIE plan was provided for review, questions or clarifications. Where a meeting did not occur, a letter update with the draft CIE plan was provided via email.

During these meetings and notifications, Enbridge provided updated information on the scope of the renewal application, and clarified that the LUP was limited to operational activities and included clearing and maintenance of its workspace and fireguard areas, seasonal access trails and shoo flies, camps, field and hazardous material storage, borrow sites and an airstrip.

In the summer 2019, Enbridge provided further updates on the LUP process and timelines. A "quick reference" document for the renewal application and a pipeline safety factsheet were provided via email. In addition, the draft CIE plan was provided again to encourage review and input. To-date, there has

been no specific feedback or input into the CIE plan.

In the fall 2019, Enbridge representatives set up multiple meetings with Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties to review the LUP process and renewal application. This includes meetings with the Tulita District Land Corporation regarding land use and access. Information was provided regarding Enbridge's existing operational plans; the Waste Management Plan and the Spill Contingency Plan. Both existing operational plans are up-to-date and in-place. Enbridge offered copies of these plans for review to interested parties. Enbridge also offered to provide an updated copy of the CIE plan prior to application. A regional update newsletter was provided that covered off information about various operational activities and projects being planned or underway along Line 21.

3.2.3 Traditional Environmental Knowledge Study

To support a greater understanding of the land related to its LUP, Enbridge commissioned a Traditional Environmental Knowledge (TEK) study in November 2013 to support the previous LUP renewal application. The study identified traditionally important land use features associated with the Line 21 pipeline in the Dehcho and Sahtu regions of the Northwest Territories.

Indigenous groups potentially affected by the land use features included under the LUP, and activities conducted on these lands, were contacted for participation in the TEK study. They include:

- Norman Wells Renewable Resource Council
- Tulita Renewable Resources Council
- Łíídlǫ́ Kúé First Nation
- Jean Marie River First Nation
- Sambaa K'e First Nation
- Pehdzeh Ki First Nation
- Fort Simpson Métis Nation Local #52

The information collected was compiled into a comprehensive TEK summary report for the impacted regions. The information provided from the TEK report continues to inform and guide Enbridge's continuing operations in the region.

3.2.4 Engagement Record

An engagement record details any engagement activities related to the LUP renewal application. Enbridge will use an internal database to track all engagements and communications with stakeholders and Indigenous groups. The engagement record will track:

- the dates of any engagement made between Enbridge and potentially affected parties
- attendees;
- the type of engagement activity (e.g. written notification, phone calls/emails, face-to-face

meetings, etc.);

- interests or concerns raised by potentially affected parties;
- any recommendations made by the potentially affected party; and
- Enbridge's response to the issues, with an indication of whether the issues are resolved or unresolved.

4. Ongoing Engagement and Communication

Enbridge will continue to engage and communicate with Regional interests potentially impacted by Line 21's operations. These methods will follow already developed communication mechanisms and processes but may evolve based on requests or feedback from parties.

Enbridge continues to develop communication materials and tactics to support access to information by interested parties and access to the Enbridge team, which may include but is not limited to:

- Ongoing teleconference and in person meetings as requested;
- Toll free phone line and email address for public inquiries;
- Project information packages that include letters, factsheets, engagement plans and maps;
- Regional newsletter updates;
- Website updates;
- Community meetings and presentations;
- An annual emergency response exercise that includes community participation;
- Videos and/or graphics on subject areas of interest such as pipeline integrity, horizontal directional drilling, safety, etc.

It is Enbridge's desire to continue to build long-standing, mutually beneficial relationships with Indigenous groups and potentially impacted parties in the Region as has been the case for more than 30 years. Enbridge remains open and willing to engage with parties in their preferred capacity and will continue to listen and understand interests and concerns with the goal of resolving those concerns in a timely manner.

Enbridge Line 21

Land Use Permit Renewal

Background

Enbridge operates Line 21 (the Norman Wells Pipeline), which carries crude oil 870 kilometres (km) from Norman Wells, Northwest Territories to Zama, Alberta, where it enters a third-party pipeline system and is sent on to Edmonton. The pipeline has been in operation since 1985. Enbridge has a land use permit (LUP) from the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB) for activities required for the safe operation and maintenance of the pipeline.

A land use permit renewal involves the issuance of a new LUP for operational and maintenance activities that have already been permitted, for a term of up to five years. Enbridge is required to re-apply for its operational LUP with the MVLWB to replace the current LUP, which expires mid-July 2020. This process has occurred several times since 1985.

To ensure there is an uninterrupted and continued high-level of oversight and diligence in operational and maintenance activities that protect people and the environment, Enbridge will submit an application for renewal of the LUP this spring.

Community and Indigenous Engagement

Enbridge has been engaging with Indigenous groups and interested parties in the Dehcho and Sahtu regions since Line 21 started operations in 1985. An Engagement Plan specific to the LUP renewal application was prepared that identified potentially affected parties and proposed engagement activities in accordance with the MVLWB's Engagement and Consultation Policy and Engagement Guidelines for Applicants and Holders of Land Use Permits and Water Licenses.

What's in Enbridge's LUP Renewal Application?

The LUP is required to allow Enbridge to conduct land use activities off the right-of-way for the operation and maintenance of Line 21, including:

- Quarrying
- Camp(s)
- Use and application of herbicide
- Clearing of vegetation (brushing) to allow access to the pipeline right-of-way
- Fuel and hazardous materials storage

There are no new land use areas or activities proposed in the operational LUP renewal application. Existing operational plans that are referenced within the application, such as the Waste Management Plan and Spill Contingency Plan, are up to date. For more information or to review a copy of these plans, please contact Enbridge.

Summary of Engagement Activities

Fall 2018 Enbridge hosted community engagement dinners in Tulita and Fort Simpson in October 2018 to continue to build and maintain relationships in the area. Enbridge initiated dialogue about the operational LUP renewal application.

Early 2019 Enbridge provided communities with a notification letter that included information about the renewal application, application timelines, a request for how communities wished to be engaged and an offer to meet to answer any questions if requested and review the draft Engagement Plan when available.

Spring 2019 A series of face-to-face meetings were held. Enbridge followed up with communities by letter.

Summer 2019 Enbridge followed up with communities to determine if there were any outstanding questions or concerns related to the operational LUP renewal application. Enbridge provided a quick reference guide and key facts about the operational LUP, a copy of the draft Engagement Plan and a pipeline safety factsheet.

Fall 2019 – Spring 2020 Ongoing teleconference and in-person meetings with communities regarding operations and maintenance work, and the operational LUP renewal application with the goal of providing opportunities for any outstanding questions to be raised and addressed. Enbridge will make a copy of the operational LUP renewal application available for review for any interested party.
