Sean, please send me draft Terms & Conditions.

I have read the comments. I don't have a lot of time to go through the response table, but I offer the following generic thoughts for consideration by the Board:

What seems to have evaded the reviewers is that:

1. This is a is a very simple and small scale logging operation to generate sustainable economic development for the Community of Jean Marie River First Nation.
2. Timber is a renewable resource. JMRFN has been logging in the area for 50 years.
3. It is not an Industrial operation of magnitude at all. JMRFN does not have the "deep financial pockets", or the human resources capacity, of an established sawmilling industrial organization. Paterson Sawmills is a "big" operation compared to this, and they are not "big".
4. GNWT has provided significant financial support over the years, and it continues to morally support (including MLA Thompson), the JMRFN sawmill project.

ENR assessment:

- This is a is a very simple and small scale logging operation to generate sustainable economic development for the Community of Jean Marie River.
- It is not intended for JMRFN to have to hire consultants; in order to meet their extensive list of surveys (both within the harvest areas, and up to 800 m outside them) and concerns.
- Their concerns are either all covered off in the application, or by the requirement from ENR Forestry to submit an Annual Operating Plan, and its incumbent requirements.

Lands:

- Deposit. GNWT has provided significant financial and morale support towards the sawmill project. The Deposit is a cost centre that needs to be waived, in the spirit of GNWT's support. As described in the application, there is a request to waive this deposit. Precedence has been set by Patterson Sawmills' LUP for a much larger volume of timber and area of operation.
- Condition 65; The concerns are either all covered off by application (e.g.; Machine Fee Zones), or by the requirement from ENR Forestry to submit an Annual Operating Plan, and its incumbent requirements. This does not need "Extra stringent " conditions; especially if on frozen ground.
