1.0 BACKGROUND

As per the requirements of the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB), the City of Yellowknife (the City) requires a Type B Land-Use Permit for the repair of a dyke on Trapper's Lake. The dyke is a component of the City's Municipal Wastewater System, and requires reconstruction as the current dyke has become overrun. In order to build the dyke, and for use in future inspections of the dyke, an access road will be built connecting the dyke to Highway 3. The work is planned to begin in August 2021, and be completed by the end of the year.

As part of preparing the Land-Use Application, the City undertook a series of activities intended to notify and inform the public and stakeholders of the project. These public engagement activities took place in March 2021.

2.0 PURPOSE

In the interest of transparency and good governance, the City has prepared this report to summarize these engagement activities. This report will be provided to the MVLWB as required for the Land-Use Permit Application.

3.0 ENGAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

The engagement process was guided by the following objectives:

- To provide affected parties and public notification of work occurring, and an opportunity to ask questions.
- To fulfill the MVLWB requirements for pre-application engagement.

4.0 WHO WAS INCLUDED IN ENGAGEMENT

The City provided a general notification of the project to all residents of Yellowknife, along with a letter to the specifically affected party. The only affected party for the project is the Trapper's Lake Spirituality Centre, as they are located on Trapper's Lake.

5.0 METHODS OF ENGAGEMENT

The City provided notification to the public of the project in order to enable public engagement. The following table provides a summary of engagement activities.
