

NDDDB Intervention for Canadian Zinc Corporation's Prairie Creek Mine Application – MV2021L2-0004 and MV2021D0005

- The Prairie Creek Mine and the proposed access road are located entirely within NDDB's Traditional Territory, directly adjacent to the community of Nahanni Butte.
- We have the greatest potential for both impacts and benefits from this development.
- We recommend that the developer works directly with us to ensure that the benefits to NDDB exceed the impacts on our community.
- We recommend that all other parties to this process respect our community's primary rights and interests within our Traditional Territory.
- We recommend that all other parties take note of the geography of this project. In particular, note that the start of the Mine access road (shown in dark red in the map), between Highway 7 and the Liard River crossing, includes:
 - The Nahanni Butte Access Road
 - A section of road, along the east bank of the Liard River, which has long been used and developed by the NDDB members as a traditional trail to access cabins and harvesting areas in the area
- Both of these segments are directly adjacent to the community of Nahanni Butte and are critical to NDDB members' ability to carry out traditional land use activities within our Traditional Territory.
