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Engagement Plan – Land Use Permit Application

Installation of New Monitoring Wells at the Norman Wells Airport, Town of Norman Wells, Northwest Territories

The following Engagement Plan presents the proposed engagement process that will allow Transport Canada and Public Services and Procurement Canada (PSPC) to identify and resolve any concerns that may arise as a result of installing two monitoring wells at Norman Wells Airport.

Identification of Potentially Affected Parties

The Sahtu Land and Water Board (the Board) was contacted on September 12, 2017, regarding the parties that should be engaged for the Land Use Permit No. S17X-004 application. The organizations originally identified by the Board are listed in Appendix A. These organizations were contacted as defined in the documents accompanying the previously accepted Permit No. S17X-004. Due to the shared project scope (drilling monitoring wells on Norman Wells Airport Property), parties that have indicated having no interest in the previous undertaking will not be re-contacted. Interested parties will also have the opportunity to comment on the project via the Board's online registry.

For this project (the drilling of two new monitoring wells), the parties that have been contacted are listed in Appendix B. This list was developed from contact with the Sahtu Land and Water Board on September 5th, 2018. The list of potentially affected parties is limited due to the scope of work and due to the work taking place on disturbed industrial land.

How Information Will be Provided to the Affected Parties and How the Affected Parties Can Provide Feedback

Engagement will be initiated through the issuance of a consultation letter, which will provide a brief summary of the undertaking and a site map showing the proposed locations for the new monitoring wells.

The affected parties will have several opportunities to provide feedback on any issues of concern:

- The affected parties will be requested to complete and return an Acknowledgement of Engagement Letter, appended to the consultation letter described above. The Acknowledgement of Engagement Letter will invite them to identify any preliminary questions or concerns they may have regarding the undertaking;
- Should it be determined to be necessary, affected parties will be invited to participate in a teleconference call with representatives from PSPC, BluMetric, and Transport Canada where project specifics can be discussed and also provided in writing upon request;
- At any time the affected parties may provide feedback in writing (mail, email or fax) or in direct calls with the project contacts. Contact details for Transport Canada will be provided in the consultation letter;



- Questions and/or concerns can be discussed during a teleconference call (if requested) with representatives of Transport Canada, PSPC and BluMetric.

Additional Points of Engagement

In the days prior to the installation of the monitoring wells, a follow-up notification will be sent to the identified affected parties by phone or email to confirm that the work is proceeding as planned. Should the drill location or timing of the work be revised, the affected parties will be notified once the details of the changes are established. The proposed and potential triggers for engagement are outlined in the Table below.
