Selwyn Project - Land Use Permit Renewal for Mineral Exploration Activities Engagement Plan and Record

Past Engagement

Selwyn Chihong Mining Ltd. (SCML) and its predecessors have engaged with communities over the years as exploration activity and project planning on the Selwyn Project has progressed. Tulita district communities were engaged during the 2007 environmental assessment for the Land Use Permit.

Negotiations took place with the Norman Wells, Tulita, and Fort Norman Métis Land Corporations and Selwyn Resources resulting in a Cooperation Agreement in 2010. Among the negotiated benefits are employment, training, business opportunities and support in the Agreement. Reports are provided that update the Land Corporations about project activities.

Periodic community visits have taken place over the years. Open house community meetings also took place in 2013 regarding upgrading and installing bridges on the Howard's Pass Access Road; this work was completed in 2014. Further community meetings were held in 2015 regarding a proposal for further road upgrading that would support the mine development.

Community engagement specific to the 2016 application for renewal of the Land Use Permit for mineral exploration took place on August 8 and 9, 2016. Engagement included meetings with each of the Norman Wells (August 8), Tulita (August 9), and Fort Norman Métis Land Corporations (August 9), and two community open houses, one in Norman Wells (6-8pm August 8 at the Dennis Drolet Memorial Hall) and one in Tulita (6-8pm August 9 at the Tulita Cultural Centre). Open houses were advertised a week in advance on community bulletin boards and on the radio. A summary of the project, past activities, and the proposed exploration program were provided as a slideshow and/or posters at all meetings and open houses.

Meetings were held with Community representatives in 2020 in regards to starting the process for the permit application for widening of the Howard's Pass Access Road; a follow up to the 2015 meetings. Additional Community Meetings were being planned for 2020 but the Covid 19 pandemic and the resulting travel bans, and considerations associated with travelling to remote communities during these times has resulted in no in community engagement during both 2020 and 2021 to date.

Current Engagement and Issue Summary

SCML circulated the application and the supporting documents that are being submitted for the current renewal permit application to the three Land Corporations and meetings to review the renewal application were requested with each of the Land Corporations Boards. To date SCML has met with Norman Wells Land Corporation, meetings dates are being finalized with both Tulita Land Corporation and Fort Norman Metis Land Corporation for October of 2021. A draft of the meeting notes from the Norman Wells Land Corporation are included, with a final signed document to be submitted. Once the meetings have been held with the other two Land Corporations SCML will provide updated documents for the community engagement records with meeting notes from these two meetings. As noted, no community meetings were planned or occurred in relation to the renewal application due to Covid 19.

Based on the engagement thus far there was general support of the activities. The key themes that arose concerned economic opportunities and proposed activities. Individuals wanted to know what employment has been given to community members to date and ensure that employment and business opportunities are given to community members in the future.

The second theme regarded proposed activities associated with the renewal application. SCML addressed this by providing information about the proposed drilling and reclamation plans and identified that the infrastructure to support these activities was already in place on the Yukon side of the project.

The pre-submission engagement log and records are presented in Attachments 4A and 4B and include draft notes from the meeting with the Norman Wells Land Corporation. Once signed by Norman Wells SCML will provide a final version. After SCML has met with the additional Land Corporations notes will be compiled and provided for this renewal application.

Future Engagement

Ongoing engagement, as required by the Cooperation Agreement, will include communications to continue to build a registry for employment and business opportunities to ensure that these opportunities are provided to community members. In addition, annual reports will provide updates on project activities. The engagement plan is presented in Attachment 4C. The plan has not been signed because it follows the protocols of the signed Cooperation Agreement.

Questions and Answers:

SCML gave an update on the Company, the project, and the proposed exploration activities for the renewal of the Land Use Permit; noting the change that was made in the reapplication that differs from the 2016 application. The essence of the application is the same except for a change requested in regards to distance from water courses. SCML also noted that the focus over the past years has been reclamation , including reclamation of trails that are no longer required. There was general discussion on Covid 19, with SCML noting the pandemic removed the ability to visit communities for engagement on the renewal application; which would have been the norm.

The following questions, comments and responses were made pertaining to the permit renewal application during the discussion. Sherry Hodgson noted that the Board would complete a quick internal review of the application and if any additional questions arose the Board will follow up by email.

What stage is SCML at in regards to the Land Use Permit?	SCML has finalized the renewal application for submission, this meeting (engagement) is a part of the process. Documents for submission have

	been finalized and were circulated for the meeting.
Does SCML have a Land Use Permit in the Yukon?	Yes, this permit expires in 2029.
Have the trails in the NWT been reclaimed?	There is a map of the trails available. As SCML intends to continue drilling not all trails have been reclaimed. Trails that were not needed were reclaimed in 2014.
