1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

This Engagement Plan for the Tłchq All-Season Road (Tłchq ASR or the Project) is prepared by the Government of the Northwest Territories Department of Infrastructure (GNWT-INF) in support of applications and construction activities under Land Use Permit W2016E0004 and Water License W2016L8-0001. While the Tłchq ASR construction and maintenance will be completed by North Star Infrastructure (NSI), responsibility for engagement rests with the GNWT-INF.

To date, the GNWT (and/or including its contractors and Tłchq ASR partners) has undertaken considerable engagement with Indigenous people and organizations, the public and regulatory authorities with respect to planning and execution; these details and associated documents are available for review in the Engagement Record.

1.2 Project Description

The Tłchq ASR will provide the community of Whatì with overland all-season access. The Tłchq ASR is as an all-season road approximately 97 kilometres (km) in length and 60 metres (m) in width with a cleared driving surface of approximately 8.5 m in width to accommodate a two-lane gravel road with culverts and/or single lane bridges over water crossings as necessary.

The Tłchq ASR is located within Mqwhì Gogha Dè Nıttłèè, the traditional territory of the Tłchq Dene. The Tłchq ASR is intended to provide improved service to the Tłchq community of Whatì, which is currently serviced by winter road.

The location of the 97 km all-season road begins at KM 196 along Highway 3 and continues in a northwesterly direction to the community government boundary of Whatì. The proposed footprint is entirely contained within the Wek'èezhì area and begins approximately 40 km southwest of Behchokò off Highway 3. Details are provided in the Project Description.

3 ENGAGEMENT METHODS

The GNWT-INF will employ a number of methods to engage affected parties depending on the nature and/or urgency of the information to be communicated. Methods that may be employed at different stages of the Tłıchǫ ASR are summarized below. Communication will predominantly occur in English; however, translation into Tłıchǫ or other Indigenous languages will be available upon request. An effort will be made to have translation services available during community meetings where Tłıchǫ is the primary language of the attendees.

A detailed engagement log of all communications, issues, and resolutions will be kept by GNWT-INF and made available to regulators and all parties involved.

3.1 Written Communications

Written communication will primarily be used as a method to inform parties about Project activities or plans. Written communications can be an effective method for the distribution of Project information. Written communications can take several forms as indicated below.

3.1.1 Electronic Mail, Faxes, and/or Letters

Electronic mail will be used to contact parties to provide Project information, arrange for teleconferences or meetings or for routine communications. When electronic mail is not available or easily accessible by affected parties, faxes and/or letters delivered by post may be utilized.

3.1.2 Newsletters

Newsletters will be issued to report on past activities, announce upcoming activities and generally communicate Tłıchǫ ASR issues or initiatives.

3.1.3 News Releases

News releases may be issued to announce significant milestones, communicate upcoming activities or in response to events.

3.1.4 Website

The Tłıchǫ ASR website will provide Tłıchǫ ASR highlights and current status as well as the tracking of the environmental assessment commitments. The current website address is <https://www.inf.gov.nt.ca/en/tlich-cho-all-season-road>.

3.1.5 Social Media

The GNWT websites, Facebook and Twitter accounts (including future forms of social media) can be utilized to provide immediate notification of updates and can provide the public with an additional communication outlet.

3.2 Verbal and Face-to-Face Communications

Verbal and/or face-to-face communications allow for focused presentation of information, immediate feedback and interactive discussion and problem solving. Verbal and face-to-face communications would typically be utilized when there is a need to present and discuss high priority issues and/or immediate feedback is desired.

3.2.1 Telephone Calls

Telephone calls with affected parties are an efficient method of communicating information quickly and receiving feedback from parties on an individual basis. Teleconferences can be organized to engage more than one party in the discussion, enabling a variety of perspectives to be presented and discussed collectively.

3.2.2 Meetings

Meetings can be more effective than telephone calls or teleconferences as participants typically commit more time. The use of visual aids can make meetings very effective. Meetings may be held with a specific group or organization or the public as a whole. The advantage of public meetings is that participants all hear the same information and may benefit from participating in discussions among various organizations or perspectives. In such cases, it is important to provide an inclusive setting in which attendees feel comfortable about participating, regardless of their perspective. As face-to-face meetings require far more resources, planning and time commitments by all parties, their application should reflect the importance of the issue. Interpretation may be provided if required.

3.2.3 Regional Offices

The Government of the Northwest Territories' Regional Offices are available for residents to provide comments and concerns, or to ask questions regarding the GNWT's activities on their own accord and at their own discretion. Often, copies of proposed works or activities are available at the local GNWT office as a resource for the local community. As a result of the GNWT's open lines of communication, well-established relationships have been built with the people and communities of the Northwest Territories. As a public entity, the GNWT will continue to maintain public access to Regional Offices and will be utilized as an additional tool for engagement.

3.2.4 Workshops and the Tłchq ASR Corridor Working Group

From time to time workshops may be utilized when information needs to be shared with a large number of people or if technical issues arise that require a deep understanding from affected parties. In order to ensure workshops achieve the highest level of success, translators will be provided where necessary. Key deliverables available to workshop participants include:

- Agenda
- Meeting notes
- Participant list
- Presentations
- Action items
- Follow-up

The GNWT has also committed to establishing the Tłchq ASR Corridor Working Group (CWG) to act as a forum for information exchange and will also play a role in engagement and joint resolution of issues. It will include the GNWT, Tłchq Government, regulatory boards and government departments, Indigenous governments or organizations, interested parties, contractor representatives, and relevant co-management boards with the Developer (GNWT-INF) as chair. It is anticipated that the CWG will meet twice per year; will operate for the construction period and up to 5 years of highway operations, unless an extension is agreed to by its parties; and will provide advice on monitoring and mitigation results that will inform adaptive management. The CWG may also serve as a forum to exchange information with academic parties and researchers. The CWG will be modeled off the Inuvik Tuktoyaktuk Highway CWG, which has been effective at dealing with issues and well received by parties. Additional specifics pertaining to the functions and operations of the CWG will be laid out in the Group's terms of reference which will be established when the Group is formed. As the CWG will include a range of regulatory agencies and affected parties, it is anticipated to be an effective forum for joint resolution of issues.

3.3 Issues Management

For engagement to be successful, parties must have an opportunity to be informed, provide input and be confident that their input is being considered. This requires that issues raised by individuals, communities, and parties are documented, tracked and a response provided. The GNWT-INF will manage issues raised during engagement as follows:

- Issues raised will be documented in engagement records which will be made available to the parties involved
- After consideration of the issue, the GNWT-INF will provide a response regarding how the issue has been or will be addressed with continued input and participation by the concerned party
- The GNWT-INF will maintain an issues tracking record which identifies the issues raised, the party raising the issue, and the response provided by the GNWT-INF

In order to succinctly summarize the issues management process described above, the GNWT-INF will utilize the Engagement Summary template, provided in Appendix A.

4 ENGAGEMENT PLAN

4.1 Planned Engagement

The following tables illustrate triggers to engagement over the life of the Tłıchq ASR authorization and methods that will be used to actively engage with parties. Table 2 includes the various engagement triggers associated with regulatory applications, and Table 3 includes triggers associated with road construction and operation. The GNWT-INF may alter proposed engagement activities in response to changes in schedule or unforeseen events.

4.2 Documenting Engagement

Engagement with affected parties for the Tłı̨chq̄ All-Season Road has been ongoing for many years. This engagement log summarizes all engagement activities with affected parties since the Land Use Permit application process of the proposed project in March 2016 (previous records were included with the Land Use Permit applications [W2016L8-0001](#), and were updated with the submission of the Adequacy Statement Response for the environmental assessment EA1617-01 [[PR#110](#)]).
