Dear Peter,

The City of Yellowknife approves of your temporary request to utilize the following services and resources for the Tlicho All-Season Road Project. Details with regards to each approval are listed below.

Waste – You had originally indicated in an email dated August 15, 2019 that an estimated quantity of one (1) thirty (30) yard bin of mixed solid waste per week and that scrap steel will go directly to Precision North Recycling. In an email received August 22, 2019 you had informed us that their water license “states that they must recycle as much as possible so I will be working with them to instate this process. Whatever materials are not recyclable; they will be incinerating.” Please keep records on how many 30 yard bins are being dumped at the Yellowknife Solid Waste Facility as we may request this information at any time to appropriately manage the landfill capacity. Under these conditions, the City of Yellowknife grants an extension of access to the landfill until December 31, 2021.


Water – In emails you had informed us that the general contractor, Kiewit, intends to install a water well in the spring of 2020, which could potentially end the need for Yellowknife potable water. In your email dated April 2, 2020 you had stated that Kiewit still has plans for a water well, but no timeline. Through Kavanaugh’s overhead water truck fill account located at Pumphouse #4, quantities of water hauled to the road project are tracked. The City of Yellowknife extends permission to truck City potable water to the Tlicho All-Season road camps at the estimated quantity of 91m³ per week until December 31, 2021.

Sewage – With regards to timelines, you had indicated in your August 15, 2019 email that Kiewit intends to construct a sewage lagoon or sewage treatment plant in the spring of 2020. In your email dated April 2, 2020 you had mentioned that Kiewit still has plans for a sewage lagoon, but no timeline. Given the information we currently have, the City approves an extension for dumping Tlicho All-Season Road sewage at either Liftstation #1 or Liftstation #5 until December 31, 2021. Dumping directly at the lagoon is not permitted.

Please note that the City will be undergoing municipal fee structure reviews and the conditions of this approval may change as they are implemented.

Thank you for your continued support with City and surrounding area initiatives.
