Lynn's Place

YWCA NWT requires a Housing Support Worker for Lynn's Safe Place for Women, located in Yellowknife. Lynn's Place is for women who need safe housing after leaving a violent relationship, or who are ready to find stability in a safe environment, and only women are permitted on site. Women are welcome to stay up to three years with their dependent children. Support Workers provide supportive crisis intervention, case management and support, advocacy, run onsite programming, and provide community referrals. Candidates must have an awareness of family violence issues facing women in the north, be empathetic and compassionate, and use a trauma-informed approach.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- collaborates with women to create a comprehensive service plan
- provides case management and advocacy to women and their children
- actively works to mitigate the impacts of mental health issues/addictions
- coordinates and monitors referrals and bridges service gaps
- liaises with other agencies
- helps women advocate for benefits, entitlements and services
- assists women to maintain income for basic needs

Qualifications:

- 2+ years' experience working with women who have experienced violence or, in a transitional housing facility, or equivalent
- training in providing support for mental health and addictions
- solid understanding of harm reduction and social determinants of health
- ability to resolve issues in a non-threatening way
- awareness of the impacts of residential schools and their effect on culture
- ability to cope well with crisis and work flexible hours
- clear criminal records check and up to date immunizations

The K'ahsho Gó'line Development Foundation, (KGDF), represents the K'ahsho Gó'line of Fort Good Hope and Colville Lake. The KGDF is a party to the "Agreement to Establish Ts'udé Nílné Tuyeta As A Protected Area." (The Establishment Agreement), pursuant to the NWT Protected Areas Act.

The KGDF requires a senior staff person to be responsible for day-to-day office functions, coordination of meetings, training and capacity development, organization of professional contracts, and to support the development and implementation of the Ts'udé Nílné Tuyeta Management Plan. This position is responsible for direction of staff and collaboration with the Management Board and the Guardians. The position is also responsible for collaboration with the Government of the Northwest Territories, which is a party to the Establishment Agreement.

Qualifications:

- minimum Diploma in Environmental Studies, Environmental Monitoring, Indigenous Studies or an equivalent field. (Degree preferred)
- minimum two years' experience leading a team towards collaborative work objectives; working with partners including government and contractors
- ability to develop a strong working understanding of the Ts'udé Nílné Tuyeta Establishment Agreement, the Ts'udé Nílné Tuyeta Management Plan, and the Terms of Reference for the Ts'udé Nílné Tuyeta Management Board
- ability to lead a team collaboratively and work effectively with all partners including government and contractors
- ability to work flexibly and adapt to evolving work objectives and experience with managing multiple projects and deadlines
- ability to manage budgets including financial and written accounting
- effective verbal/written communication skills and proficient computer skills
